Dear David

Your OIA request of 17 May 2019 concerning the Medical Issues Working Group (MIWG) was partially transferred to the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) on 22 May.

The parts of the OIA that were transferred to and accepted by MBIE were "official information associated with":

1. the internal documentation between MBIE, and the medical working group...or those associated with the creation and formation of the group.

and

2. copies of the internal MBIE documentation that details who the group is answerable to, the structure and number of memebers in the group, and whether this group has any obligation's to consult with ACC claimant advocacy groups and or ACC claimant lead feedback groups or organisations.

MBIE was not involved in the formation of the MIWG and its involvement was limited to attendance of the four meetings between December 2016 and November 2017.

As such, the second part of the request transferred to us is being refused under section 18(g) of the Official Information Act 1982 as we have do not hold this information.

MBIE found four documents in scope from the MIWG process. We understand that you will be receiving these documents as part of ACC's response. Therefore, we are not releasing the following documents:
