Thanks for your email.

I met with the property owner last Friday and she showed me the pipe that had been leaking in her basement garage, and the dried up substance on the footpath. The property owner had engaged a plumber to plug the leaking pipe, and this had fully stopped the discharge by the time I attended. The blue substance was very clearly **not** sewage, storm water or drinking water and came from private pipework within the garage. I am therefore

confused as to why this would be considered in any way as coming from WDC's infrastucture. My suspicion is that this is an old gas works lateral that was filled with some substance upon decommissioning, but that's a suspicion only. Despite clearly not coming from a WDC asset, our Roading Contractor did cordon off the affected area of footpath and prevented the substance from entering the nearby mudtank.

I have been on-site again this morning to investigate the reported road and footpath leaks. Whilst there is a small amount of ground water weeping from various surfaces (as it does every time it rains, at this location and all around Oamaru), there is no blue substance of any description coming from the road or footpath. If we get more than two consecutive dry days this summer, these 'leaks' will soon disappear.

Hi Gen,

Here are the water team notes regarding the Isis Street incident and our limited involvement with it. I have copied in everyone involved so they can make sure what I have said is true.

## 10/01/2019

- · Kerryn (CCT) received a call from the owner of 25 Isis Street reporting toxic gas at her property. Kerryn directed her to ORC as it is pollution. Caitlin confirmed with Kerryn that was the appropriate approach.
- ORC emailed Gen later in the afternoon advising that if there was no impact on a watercourse, they will not look into it and expected WDC to respond.
- Gen and Maddy visited the site and confirmed blue coloured liquid was flowing across the footpath into the kerb and channel and mudtank.
- The matter was referred to the roading team as it involves roading assets and not public stormwater or wastewater assets.
- It was confirmed the mudtank and footpath would be cleaned that night. Gen issued the instruction to the SouthRoads roading team on roading's behalf.

## 11/01/2019

 Oscar visited the site on Friday morning to see if the liquid was still flowing. The property owner showed him the location in her basement where the liquid had flowed out of an old gas pipe. The pipe was now capped and the liquid on the footpath had dried so no further action was taken by the water team.

### 12/01/2019

- · SouthRoads received a call reporting seepage from the footpath outside 26 Isis Street.
- · Warren visited the site and confirmed that no action was required by the SouthRoads operator. He had visited the site a couple of months prior with leak detection equipment to determine if the seepage was a leak and concluded no it was not a leak.

- Oscar received a CRM regarding the seepage from the footpath outside 26 Isis Street. He visited the site and also concluded it
  was not a water leak.
- Oscar received an email from ORC requesting an update on the situation and advising they will look to prosecute if nothing is
  done. Oscar replied advising it is not a WDC asset but are responding anyway. He requested a high level meeting to discuss how
  such situations should be managed going forward (a copy of the email can be provided if necessary but Jason was copied in).
- · Lichelle advised Oscar that she would be looking after it from here.
- Tom Reading contacted Warren asking if he could take a chlorine test of the water seeping from the foothpath. Oscar and Warren confirmed there was insufficient flow to be able to conduct such a test and was pointless as it was not a leak. Tom Reading requested Warren contact Tom Palmer from Foley Plumbing who believes there is a water leak.
- Warren contacted Tom Palmer who had responded to another leak from a gas main on the corner of Rother and Towey Street.
   He felt SouthRoads was responding to the same issue. Warren confirmed with SouthRoads that they had fixed a leaking toby on Rother Street and that was all.

I agree with this assessment, and believe it is simply ground water finding the path of least resistance following rain.

There are mudtanks on the intersecton of Wye and Isis, which discharge to the SIMTR corridor. thinks the two issues may be related, and I agreed that they may be, or if not directly related then certainly the same sort of phenomenon. 

Sorry this has taken a bit longer to get to you than i would have liked.

As you can see there were respectable amounts of iron and zinc in the water, and that, coupled with the presence of a small amount of copper, is likely to be the cause of the colour noted at the time of the spill.

There is no reason to suspect any other contaminant of significance.
