I decided to extend the time frame for making a decision on your request under section 15A of the Act by an additional 15 working days because of the consultations needed to make a decision on your request. I apologise that the date of your initial request was incorrectly recorded in the letter notifying you of the extended time frame.

I am emailing to ask whether it would be possible for the Prime Minister to deliver the keynote speech at the inaugural New Zealand Young Women's Festival (Wāhine Kākano) on the 26th of May in Auckland.

To give you a bit of information about the event, Wahine Kakano - The NZ Young Women's Festival has grown out of a collaboration between Villainesse and the Human Rights Commission. The idea is to create a yearly, free event for young women aged between 16 and 22, designed to inspire and empower them. The basic format is that there will be one keynote speech, three panel discussions and two sessions for workshops, which will enable the participants to hear from a range of extraordinary women and to forge connections with their peers at other schools and universities. We have big dreams for the festival, and hope that it will become bigger and better every year.

This year we have been very fortunate to have AUT, Countdown, ASB, Spark and the Ministry for Women come on board as sponsors, which will enable us to give approximately 380 young women from all different cultural and socio-economic backgrounds the opportunity to attend the festival. We would absolutely love it if the Prime Minister would consider giving the keynote speech (currently scheduled for 9:10am-9:40am with a 15 minute Q&A) on the day.

Please let me know whether this would be at all possible. If there is a timing clash with the Prime Minister's schedule, we'd be happy to adapt our schedule to try to accommodate her. We know that our attendees would get so much out of hearing from the PM, so we'll be as flexible as we possibly can.

Please let me know if I can provide any other information.
