Thank you for your email of 2 August 2019 requesting the following information under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act):

> A copy of any formal advice received from officials relating to your establishment of a BDMRR Act working group of experts

I have interpreted your request as seeking official documentation and correspondence such as Cabinet papers, reports and briefings relating to the establishment of the Working Group for reducing barriers to changing registered sex (the Working Group).

A number of briefings and other papers related to the establishment of the Working Group will be available on the Department's website by 30 September 2019. As such, these are not being provided to you here.









Following my announcement of the establishment of the Working Group on 1 August 2019, I noted that the Registrar-General would from that date waive fees associated with applying to change registered sex on a birth certificate. This work is noted in some of the material provided to you here and is also noted in some material soon to be publicly available. However, the ultimate decision to waive the fees sits with the Registrar-General and not myself.

As is required by section 9(1) of the Act, I have considered whether the grounds for withholding this information are outweighed by other considerations which would make it desirable, in the public interest, to make that information available. In this instance, I do not consider that to be the case.
