Broadcasting Act 1989

Prohibition on paid election programmes

Except as provided in [[subsections (2) and (2A)]] of this section, no broadcaster shall permit the broadcasting, within or outside an election period, of an election programme. Nothing in subsection (1) of this section applies in respect of-

an opening address or closing address that is broadcast-

for a political party or group of related political parties; and

by TVNZ or RNZ during time allocated to that political party or group of related political parties under section 73(1); or]]

An election programme broadcast for a political party or group of related political parties and paid for with money allocated to that political party or group of related political parties under section 74A of this Act; or

An election programme-(c)

Broadcast for a fee or other consideration; and

relating solely to 1 named constituency candidate at an election; and]]

(iii) Used or appearing to be used to promote or procure the election of the

candidate; and

Broadcasting Act 1989

Offences

Every person commits an offence and is liable on summary condiction to a fine not exceeding \$100,000 who-

Fails to comply with section 70 or section 77(1) Section 79A or section 79B or (a) section 79C of this Act; or

In an election period,— (b)

- Broadcasts an election programme for or behalf of a political party; or
- Arranges for the broadcasting of a lection programme for or on behalf of a political party-

other than pursuant to, and in conformity with, this Part of this Act.]
