Section 45 – Samples or illustrations

(1) The importer of goods must furnish free of charge, such samples, illustrations, drawings, documents, or plans relating to the goods as may be required by a

Customs officer for the purposes of analysis, classification, or record.

(2) Any sample required to be furnished in accordance with sub-section (1) must be as small as possible for the purpose for which it is taken.

Section 151 – Examination of goods subject to control of Customs.

(1) A Customs officer may examine, weigh, analyse, or test, or cause to be examined, weighed, analysed, or tested goods subject to the control of the Customs or goods that the officer has reasonable cause to suspect are subject to the control of the Customs, and may, for that purpose, open or cause to be opened any packages in which the goods are contained or suspected to be contained.
