• What cultural intelligence and cultural awareness and sensitivity training and reform arose out of the consequences of the Ahmed Zaoui Case?

Our response

While there was no specific cultural training which arose out of the Ahmed Zaoui case, the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment does have a range of intercultural training available to all MBIE staff.

That training covers the following:

- Intercultural Awareness Module
- Maori Cultural Intelligence
- Unconscious Bias
- MBIE has an Inclusion and Diversity Strategy and there is a programme of learning coming from that for 2020.
- MBIE is the lead agency in the Cross-agency project called Intercultural Competency
 Development which has just finished its pilot stage. This will be delivered to all MBIE staff in
 2020.
