Due to the tight timeline we are working to, could the review please be returned to me by 5pm on Friday 13th May, to ensure that any corrections are included in the report.

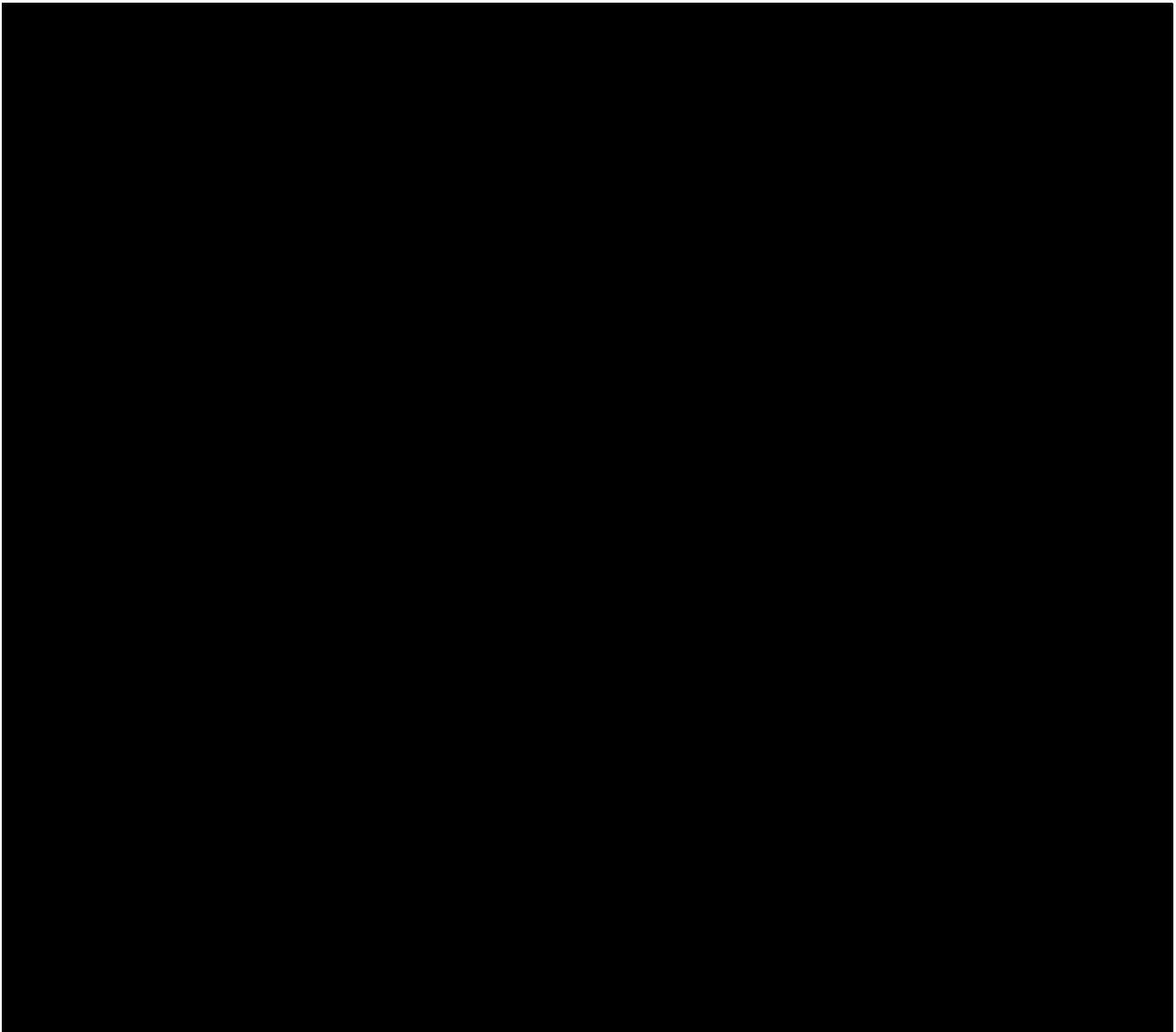
