The way we see it is that Parliament created the s168A power to ensure that regulator maintains the scope of these core definitions - which set the boundary between motor vehicles and other vehicles - over time to deal with new vehicles as they enter the system, as it has already done with e-bikes and e-scooters.

And once these vehicles are an accepted part of the transport system, we look to use an appropriate legislative opportunity such as a regulatory systems Bill, to bring these declared vehicles into the core definitions in the Act, and at the same time pick up other equivalent vehicles.

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 We'd also use the consultation process to ask whether we should (in a subsequent legislative vehicle) improve the operation of the section 168A power for the future – as set out in the Minister's letter to the regulations review committee. We could in the future also refine the LTA definitions, by packaging up any existing declarations and equivalent vehicles to reflect them into the Act's definitions.

Based on this approach, we are preparing an updated table to show the status of the different types of vehicles, where and how they can use footpaths and other paths.
