We recognise that free speech, academic freedom and freedom of expression are contentious and nuanced issues worldwide. We are currently working on a Freedom of Expression Policy as a public statement to reaffirm our commitment to free speech and academic freedom, and an External Speaker Code of Practice, to provide more guidance to

speakers on our three campuses.

- Massey University is Rainbow Tick certified, meaning it promises to provide a safe and inclusive environment for all, can you explain how hosting an event by a group such as Stand Up For Women fits in with that commitment?

Massey University strongly and openly supports the sexual- and gender-diverse community, and safety and wellbeing of students and staff is a top priority. We do not share the views of the speakers of this event. We are proud to have the Rainbow Tick, to collaborate on diversity and inclusion, and to focus on always improving how we operate.

We will be donating the proceeds of the venue booking to a sexual- or gender-diverse group and we welcome suggestions on this.

We are currently placing signs, flags and posters around our campuses to show support for our sexual- and gender-diverse community and we will be increasing this over the next few weeks so that our people are aware of our commitment to diversity and inclusion. The rainbow and transgender flags will fly prominently on campus wherever possible. We will be taking active steps to ensure that the participants of this event will have to arrive to a venue that is very clearly pro-rainbow, and that our staff and students experience our support.

In addition, we are looking at potential events to ensure the community is well supported by the university, and currently considering how we can better support our staff and students who belong to the sexual- or gender-diverse community.

- Last year Don Brash was banned from speaking at the university - how is this situation different to that one?

Dr Brash was never banned from the university. The event was cancelled because of a security threat. It was subsequently rescheduled and held without incident on October 17. The Martin Report, a review released late last year, thoroughly examined all the material on the incident and concluded that our actions were appropriate. Since then, we have been considering our position on a range of issues including academic freedom and free speech. These issues are of critical importance.

Supporters of this group include members of the Rainbow community - its not a case of Rainbow community vs them. The key issue is around their views on transwomen and trans inclusivity.

They seem to have 2 main arguements - that trans inclusivity is a threat to womens rights and that gender is biologically determined and cant be changed.

All of our advisory panels finish their term on monday 30 Sept (tomorrow) so we are not able to seek advice from them. However we did have clear advice from the Rainbow panel earlier this year during the Pride discussions that they wanted us to remain involved in the Pride festival, in large part because the festival is an inclusive space for the trans community. Thier view was that supporting the trans community was very important as they are marginalised within the rainbow community, and within the non rainbow community.

Kia ora Studio One,

I trust everyone is doing well. I am getting in touch with you as it came to my attention through many of my colleagues and our community that a conversation with Meghan Murphy is being held organised by Speak Up For Women at Studio One on 18th November.

Since we are colleagues and operate somewhat in the same field of the arts, I want to express my concern that this event is being held at Studio One and I would like to ask as a colleague for Studio One to withdraw giving a platform to ideas we view as destructive towards an already marginalised group. As Artspace Aotearoa, but also as humans, we have an obligation to protect these voices and support them where possible, to look for solution of cohabitation and to creatively thinking about solutions that appear in our reality. The event that Studio One is

hosting we feel does nothing to progress that very notion of civic society, in fact we think it offers an active diminishing and destruction of social fabric by upholding viewpoints that exclude trans people rights.

I am sure this was an oversight on Studio One's part and we want to make you aware that very different views exist towards the rights of trans people, one's that we feel are more positive, critical and constructive. What frightens us as cultural practitioners as well is that Meghan Murphy will focus on the event to speak about the 'controversies' and the 'banning of twitter', which very much reminds me of the Southern/Molyneux visit last year, which clearly feeds from the controversies that it puts itself out there in the world. It therefore becomes a non-discussion and a non-event, but at stake are real life issues for real-life marginalised voices, in this case, the trans community.

This, as was said when she was visiting the Scottish Parliament, is 'stoking a fire' for the reason of well, of 'stoking a fire'. We think it is unacceptable on a day where we as arts professionals try to fire up the imagination towards each other, and thus positively imagine the other, not to discard them and remove them from our view. We hope you feel the same and re-consider this event to take place in your venue.

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

Kia ora Studio One.

I trust everyone is doing well. I am getting in touch with you as it came to my attention through many of my colleagues and our community that a conversation with Meghan Murphy is being held organised by Speak Up For Women at Studio One on 18th November.

Since we are colleagues and operate somewhat in the same field of the arts, I want to express my concern that this event is being held at Studio One and I would like to ask as a colleague for Studio One to withdraw giving a platform to ideas we view as destructive towards an already marginalised group. As Artspace Aotearoa, but also as humans, we have an obligation to protect these voices and support them where possible, to look for solution of cohabitation and to creatively thinking about solutions that appear in our reality. The event that Studio One is hosting we feel does nothing to progress that very notion of civic society, in fact we think it offers an active diminishing and destruction of social fabric by upholding viewpoints that exclude trans people rights.

I am sure this was an oversight on Studio One's part and we want to make you aware that very different views exist towards the rights of trans people, one's that we feel are more positive, critical and constructive. What frightens us as cultural practitioners as well is that Meghan Murphy will focus on the event to speak about the 'controversies' and the 'banning of twitter', which very much reminds me of the Southern/Molyneux visit last year, which clearly feeds from the controversies that it puts itself out there in the world. It therefore becomes a non-discussion and a non-event, but at stake are real life issues for real-life marginalised voices, in this case, the trans community.

This, as was said when she was visiting the Scottish Parliament, is 'stoking a fire' for the reason of well, of 'stoking a fire'. We think it is unacceptable on a day where we as arts professionals try to fire up the imagination towards each other, and thus positively imagine the other, not to discard them and remove them from our view. We hope you feel the same and re-consider this event to take place in your venue.



Auckland, 8 October - 'A Conversation with Meghan Murphy' - part of Speak Up For Women's Feminism 2020 programme - has been relocated by Auckland Council.

Originally booked for the iconic Studio One Toi Tu on the corner of Ponsonby and K Road in the heart of the city's rainbow community, the event has now been moved to the Western Springs Garden Community Hall.

Auckland Council moved the location after receiving numerous complaints "from individuals and organisations within the rainbow community".

Jenny Whyte, Event Manager for Speak Up For Women,says: "The Council told us they have been pressured to cancel the venue and warned that if the event goes ahead there will be protest action.

"They were primarily concerned about managing safety at Studio One, apparently Western Springs will be a more secure site. We are grateful to the Council for taking threats to safety seriously, though

we support the right to peaceful protest.

"A secondary reason for relocating the event, Auckland Council said, was to placate the 'rainbow community'. Many of our members and supporters are lesbian, gay and bisexual. If other members of our community take issue with us we invite them to engage directly with us"

Hamish McGregor, co-founder of the group Homosexual Adult Human Males, says: "There is a growing number of gay men that see the insidious misogyny facing lesbians. We stand with our sisters in resisting attempts by factions within the community to redefine homosexuality.

Auckland Council's decision to honour Speak Up For Women's venue booking follows the High Court ruling last week against the Free Speech Coalition who challenged Council's right to cancel the venue booked for controversial Canadian speakers Lauren Southern and Stefan Molyneux.

Dr David Cumin of Free Speech Coalition says: "The Bill of Rights Act provides for any group to freely express their ideas in public. The High Court ruling that Council Controlled Organisation venues are not for the public is something we will challenge. Despite that, the decision to allow this event to go ahead is commendable. We must be able to challenge and be challenged by ideas; we must not be forced to submit our thought to whoever is in charge or whoever threatens violence.

Ms Whyte says: "It's disgraceful that women meeting to discuss feminism can draw such a vitriolic response for a small but vocal minority of 'rainbow' activists.

I trust everyone is doing well. I am getting in touch with you as it came to my attention through many of my colleagues and our community that a conversation with Meghan Murphy is being held organised by Speak Up For Women at Studio One on 18th November.

Since we are colleagues and operate somewhat in the same field of the arts, I want to express my concern that this event is being held at Studio One and I would like to ask as a colleague for Studio One to withdraw giving a platform to ideas we view as destructive towards an already marginalised group. As Artspace Aotearoa, but also as humans, we have an obligation to protect these voices and support them where possible, to look for solution of cohabitation and to

creatively thinking about solutions that appear in our reality. The event that Studio One is hosting we feel does nothing to progress that very notion of civic society, in fact we think it offers an active diminishing and destruction of social fabric by upholding viewpoints that exclude trans people rights.

I am sure this was an oversight on Studio One's part and we want to make you aware that very different views exist towards the rights of trans people, one's that we feel are more positive, critical and constructive. What frightens us as cultural practitioners as well is that Meghan Murphy will focus on the event to speak about the 'controversies' and the 'banning of twitter', which very much reminds me of the Southern/Molyneux visit last year, which clearly feeds from the controversies that it puts itself out there in the world. It therefore becomes a non-discussion and a non-event, but at stake are real life issues for real-life marginalised voices, in this case, the trans community.

This, as was said when she was visiting the Scottish Parliament, is 'stoking a fire' for the reason of well, of 'stoking a fire'. We think it is unacceptable on a day where we as arts professionals try to fire up the imagination towards each other, and thus positively imagine the other, not to discard them and remove them from our view. We hope you feel the same and re-consider this event to take place in your venue.



The legal advice we have received is that cancellation of the event, as concluded by the report, is the only way to eliminate the risk to health and safety and to ensure that the University would not be in breach of its health and safety obligations.

Massey University is committed to the values of academic freedom, the freedom of speech, and the freedom of expression, as values that lie at the very heart of the tradition of a university and academic inquiry. However, this event has created significant disruption to our students, staff and University operations, and we cannot accept any further risk or issues, or any risk of potential harm that may impact upon a particularly vulnerable community.

Kia ora Cathy,

First of all congratulations on being re-elected to council, it's fantastic to have you back representing our city. I deeply appreciate the work you did in your previous term for rainbow communities!

I'm concerned that Auckland Council is giving platform to the anti-trans organisation 'Speak Up For Women (SUFW)' - specifically created to try and undo progress for our trans and non binary communities, and advocate against trans self identification, trans women in sport, and the rights of trans women specifically.

Council has moved it from its original location, Studio One Toi Tu, to Western Springs.

I believe the rationale behind that shift should also be the rationale behind preventing them from using a council venue altogether.

The organisation exists almost exclusively to disseminate anti-trans messages, often using coded language that can be perceived as harmless to those who are cis gendered/heterosexual and not attuned to their dog-whistles. It is not immediately obvious that this group are an anti-trans hate group, but there is a raft of evidence that supports this, as well as the fact they're funded and supported by far-right organisations (family first, new conservatives etc.) as well as British anti-trans activists. They are a well-funded, well-organised group that has already successfully halted progress on trans rights.

Their transphobia is demonstrably harmful to trans and non binary communities as highlighted in the recent 'Counting Ourselves' report which details the significant inequities that trans and non binary communities face at the hand of discrimination in every aspect in their lives. The pervasive transphobia that these communities face results in 71% of trans and non binary people suffering from high or very high levels of psychological distress. This is in comparison to 8% of the general population.

By giving platform to these harmful views, Auckland Council are increasing the harm done to trans and non binary communities. As an organisation with the Rainbow Tick, and as an organisation that works closely with Auckland Pride to deliver the 'Proud Centres' during the Auckland Pride Festival (where Auckland Council opens up their community centres for two weeks to enable diverse rainbow communities to program events for free) I expect Auckland Council to put the needs of one of Aotearoa's most vulnerable communities before the programming needs of this hate group.

I would expect at the very minimum that Auckland Council take the same approach as they did to Lauren Southern and Stephen Molyneux - and not give a platform to or be supportive of hate speech.

SUFW are perceived to be a significant threat towards improving the well-being and support for our trans and non binary communities, and indeed to the progress of trans rights in Aotearoa more generally.

It would be deeply appreciated if you and your colleagues could work with the Council Chief Executive to ensure this event is not allowed an Auckland Council Platform. Deplatforming hateful views that are inconsistent with Council values is not stifling freedom of speech. While freedom of expression is enshrined in our laws, freedom to a platform to spread hate is not. I hope Council can see the distinction, and follow Massey University's lead by removing them from Council venues.

Below is some of the information we talked about:

1. Red Badge security would be our recommendation for you to speak with around security for the event and your guests.

1. What legal opinion or advice do you have re the right to Freedom of Speech in Auckland Council venues? Is this consistent with council's stance in the past on other Freedom of speech matters?

We understand your concerns but we do not share legal advice outside of our organisation.

2. Can you send us your policy on bookings and venue use (if any) and how this pertains to values etc?

Attached is the 2014 Hire Fee Framework and the terms and conditions of hire. The hire fee framework was created with an operational focus on removing barriers to participation, ensuring public spaces are freely accessible to all.

- 3. Have you consulted with your Rainbow Committee and what is their stance formally on the matter?
- 4. Can you confirm that the old and new venues are Proud Centres?

ProudCentres is a programme response that activities a number of the more characterful and activated Arts and Community Centres within Auckland. Studio One Toi Tu was one of eight centres that featured within the inaugural programme on 2018 and will continue to be a part of the approach in future. The purpose / focus of the Proudcentres programme is as follows.

Taking Pride to the suburbs!

VISION - WHAT?

To be a **Platform** for education, acceptance and celebration of our diverse Rainbow communities and their allies in their local centres, across Tamaki Makaurau.

MISSION - HOW?

Partnering with our Rainbow communities and their allies to build connection, awareness and leadership opportunities in the LGBTQIA+ community.

OBJECTIVES

Proud Centres is committed to **deliver free local events** which instil pride, celebrate unity and embrace diversity across Tamaki Makaurau.

Proud Centres is committed to **create an environment** for advocacy, networking, outreach and support services for LGBTQIA+ people, their families, allies across Tamaki Makaurau.

Proud Centres is committed to **supporting local activities that inform and educate the general public** and local rainbow community about LGBTQIA+ culture.

5. Do you have any terms relating to these venues being Proud Centres which you can share with us..ie committed to LGBTTI+ safe space?

6. If staff are having to work at the venue on the day, have you considered a clear statement with the option that staff should not have to work if they feel unsafe - physically or emotional and how will you support them/manage this?

Western Springs Garden Community Hall is an unstaffed venue for hire so there are not usually staff present at the venue. The venue is instead serviced remotely from a central location by our team of service delivery coordinators. A service delivery coordinator may be present at the event if technical assistance is needed and we will work with our service delivery coordinators closer to the time to determine what involvement may be required. The safety and wellbeing of our staff is very important to us and, if attendance is required at the site, we will be speaking to our staff to ensure that they are not required to do anything which impacts on their safety or wellbeing.

7. Can you commit to participating in the workshop we are organisation on Freedom of Speech guidelines for Rainbow Tick organisations? A commitment here to a way forward would be a signal from Auckland Council that internally and externally around the need to build a plan into the future. Let me know what else you need from me on this?

Our operational team would be happy to take part in this workshop. Note any changes to our current operating framework would require governance approval.

8. Any other documentation or consideration you feel would be helpful.

We spoke to the organisers after we were made aware that there may be protests at the event, and we wanted a safer and more appropriate place, should this happen.

We know that the speaker is seen by many as having views that are harmful to transgender communities. We have also heard the complaints and concerns raised by

our Rainbow Communities and our partners at this Proud Centre. In this respect we want to put on record that we do not support or endorse the views of the speakers at the event.

We do, however, recognise that Aucklanders hold a wide range of views on issues and that the right to free speech is protected by the Bill of Rights."


