Dear Mr Ikilei

Thank you for your email of 21 January 2020, requesting information about staff 'callbacks'. Your request has been considered under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA).

You may be interested to note that Corrections is currently undertaking a national review of shift patterns for staff. The review, 'Making Shifts Work', is a substantial project for Corrections and includes input from senior Corrections staff and union representatives.

'Making Shifts Work' is designed to deliver flexible roster patterns that provide safer and better working conditions for corrections officers and create more opportunities for increased rehabilitation and structured activity for prisoners.

You requested:

The frequency of 'callbacks', that is, the process of contacting an off-duty Corrections Officer to come back to on-duty status... for the following prisons:

- Rimutaka prison
- Spring Hill prison
- Auckland South (Wiri) prison

and that the information be from the last three years.

As you may be aware, callbacks occur when an employee is called back to work after having ceased work, or before their normal start time. Corrections generally uses callbacks when a minimum of three additional hours' work is guaranteed. Callbacks are most frequently used to cover shifts that cannot otherwise be filled, often at short notice. This is generally because the staff member who was originally rostered to work a shift has taken sick leave, or other leave at short notice, such as domestic or bereavement/tangihanga leave.



Please find the requested information for Rimutaka Prison and Spring Hill Corrections Facility, broken down by month, attached as Appendix One.

Auckland South Corrections Facility (ASCF), which is managed by Serco rather than Corrections, does not operate a callback system. Where there is a need to create ad-hoc staffing arrangements, ASCF uses overtime to fill staffing gaps. Although callbacks may be used from time to time, centralised records of this are not kept by ASCF. Accordingly, the part of your request which pertains to ASCF is declined pursuant to section 18(g) of the OIA, as the information requested is not held by Corrections, and we have no grounds for believing it to be held by another agency.

I trust the information provided is of assistance. Should you have any concerns with this response, I would encourage you to raise these with Corrections.
