Thank you for your email of 5 February 2020, requesting information about temporary release from prison. Your request has been considered under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA).

You requested:

In regards to life sentenced inmates, that are yet to reach first parole. At what point, if any is he/she able to apply for day release or weekend release to spend with family/spouse/children? Is such thing possible before parole eligibility? If so, under what grounds? And how is an inmate to go about it?

If a prisoner would like to be assessed for temporary release, we encourage them to speak to unit staff or their case manager in the first instance.
