Official Information Act 1982 request

Thank you for your Official Information Act 1982 (OIA) request of 26 March 2020 regarding the Waitangi Tribunal. Specifically, you requested:

“(1) the average time-frame it has taken the Waitangi Tribunal from receiving a claim relating to proposed legislation (i.e. relating to the Tribunal's jurisdiction under s 8 of the Treaty of Waitangi Act 1975) to issuing a report in respect of such a claim; and

(2) the number of (and name of the) reports since 1990 in which the Waitangi Tribunal has found that a statutory instrument was inconsistent with the principles of the Treaty of Waitangi. “

The Ministry of Justice is responding and re-directing resources as needed, to assist with the government's response to COVID-19. This is impacting our ability to deliver some of our usual functions within the normal timeframes. In the current climate it is not possible to provide you with a definitive date by which we will be able to respond to your request. Please be assured that we will keep you updated and will provide you with a new expected due date as soon as we are in a position to do so. We are grateful for your patience and understanding in these unprecedented times.

The OIA requires that we advise you of our decision on your request no later than 20 working days after the day we received your request. As mentioned above, it will not be possible to meet that time limit. Therefore, we are writing to notify you of an extension of the time to make our decision, to within 20 working days of the office re-opening.

Please be assured that we will provide you with a response earlier than the new due date if circumstances permit. We are grateful for your patience and understanding in these unprecedented times.
