Action points and learning's will be recorded. Clarify any misunderstandings. At the conclusion, notes of the debrief will be typed up and copies distributed to those present. All information may be discoverable under OIA Focus on five W's: What actually happened? What should have happened? What have we learned from this? What will we do about it?




