



# **FUNDING AGREEMENT**

Under the Ministry for Primary Industries and the Royal New Zealand Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA)

# **FUNDING AGREEMENT**

#### **BACKGROUND**

- A. The Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) and the Royal New Zealand Society for the Prevention OF Cruelty to Animals (SPCA) are parties to a Memorandum of Understanding dated on or about 14<sup>th</sup> of May 2019 ("**MOU**") under which they may from time to time enter into additional agreements to support compliance and enforcement activities.
- B. This document is an Appendix to the MOU and when signed (read together with the MOU), forms an "Agreement". Terms used but not defined in this 'Funding Agreement' have the meanings given to them in the MOU. The MOU applies to and governs this agreement as if set out in full herein in its entirety.
- C. The purpose of this Agreement is to record MPI's funding contributions to the SPCA, and the roles and responsibilities of the Parties in relation to use of that funding. This Agreement replaces any earlier Funding Agreements between the parties.

#### 1. ADDITIONAL DEFINED TERMS

1.1. The terms used in the MOU have the same meaning in this Funding Agreement, and in addition the following terms have the following meanings:

MOU means the Memorandum of Understanding between MPI and the SPCA.

Funding Agreement means the MPI and the SPCA Funding Agreement' between the parties

**Funding Instalment** means the amount (excluding GST,) as provided for in clause 4.2, to be paid by MPI to the SPCA at the beginning of each Quarter.

#### 2. TERM OF THIS FUNDING AGREEMENT

Commencement Date: this Funding Agreement commences and ends at the same time as the MOU.

This Funding Agreement does not have a finite end date and may be revised at any time by either party.

## **Funding Instalments**

4.1. The Parties acknowledge that total MPI expenditure under this Funding Agreement may not exceed the following annual amounts (excl. GST) unless revised and agreed to by both parties.

#### 4.4. Varying Funding Instalments

4.5. During any Financial Year, either party may request that the amounts of the Funding Instalments be reviewed and changed, both within or across Financial Years. Each party will use its best endeavours (and in the case of MPI will work with Treasury and Ministers) to ensure this flexibility is achieved, provided that the total amount as set out in this Funding Agreement is not exceeded.

#### **Process for making payments**

- 4.6. Each party must maintain a bank account with a New Zealand-registered bank. Subject to the provisions of this Agreement, MPI will pay each Funding Instalment into that bank account held by the SPCA.
- 4.7. No Funding Instalments paid to the SPCA under this Agreement, nor any monies provided pursuant to this Funding Agreement, nor any income (including any interest) received with respect to either shall be used for any purpose other than carrying out the SPCA's obligations under this Agreement, any other Agreement made under the MOU, or Animal Welfare Legislation.
- 4.8. The party designated in clause 4.2 as:
  - a) the recipient of a Funding Instalment for any Quarter may issue a GST invoice to the paying party during the prior Quarter; and
  - b) the paying party shall, following receipt of such invoice, pay each Funding Instalment by the thirtieth day of the first Month of each Quarter. In respect of payments from MPI to NAIT, the payment will only be made if MPI determines that the SPCA has:
    - (i) complied with this Agreement in all material respects; and
    - (ii) complied with any applicable national policy statements or standards issued by the Minister in accordance with Animal Welfare Legislation.

#### 5. SPCA'S DELIVERY and REPORTING OBLIGATIONS

#### 5.1 Delivery:

The SPCA will in exchange for the MPI funding deliver annual and ongoing compliance and enforcement services for complaints pertaining to the areas defined in clause 3.4 of the MOU.

## Reporting:

The SPCA will provide MPI with annual statistics as outlined in clause 13.1 of the MOU, namely:

- (a) number of complaints received (nationally) by species;
- (b) number of infringement notices issued under regulations under the Act;
- (c) number of prosecutions (nationally), including the number of prosecutions that have resulted in conviction/s; and

- (d) number of persons charged with offences in legal proceedings that have not yet been concluded.
- 5.2 The reporting period shall be 1 July to 30 June of the following year. Statistics for each reporting period must be supplied within three months after that reporting period ends (ie, by 1 October).

#### 6. **OTHER**

#### Ongoing restrictions

- 6.1. The SPCA shall:
  - not without prior consultation with MPI act as a guarantor for a loan by another a) entity, or grant an indemnity to another entity;
  - b) maintain its financial viability and operate on a not-for-profit basis:
  - c) not act in a manner that may bring any of the parties to the MOU into disrepute.
- The constitution of the SPCA shall and shall continue to make provision for the objectives 6.2. and principal activities of the SPCA to be the same as those referred to in the MOU, and such provisions may not be revoked or amended without the prior written consent of the parties to the MOU.

#### **Termination of Funding Agreement**

The parties agree that the Funding Agreement does not have a termination date and that the MOU provides the appropriate mechanisms for terminating any agreements between the parties.

In 20XX/YY there were 144 charges filed against 26 defendants. There were 28 defendants sentenced in 20XX/YY resulting in convictions on 47 charges (irrespective of when charges were filed).

Of note there was one successful regulatory prosecution for Regulation 51 – Tail Docking for dogs in 20XX/YY.

Investigation Outcomes	Definition
Open - under investigation	The final outcome has not been determined as the complaint is still being investigated by SPCA
No Welfare Concern	The inspector found no breaches of the Animal Welfare Act 1999, Regulations or the Codes of Welfare at initial inspection. Complaint was unfounded (possibly malicious or just misguided).
Closed	The investigation has concluded as the welfare issues identified (typically minor) have been resolved or mitigated without meeting the threshold for verbal advice
Other Agency Transfer	The complaint was received by SPCA but has been transferred to another agency to investigate (ie MPI, DairyNZ, Animal Control, Police)
Verbal Advice	The owner or person in charge (PIC) has been given verbal advice as to their obligations under the Animal Welfare Act 1999
Education Handout	The owner or PIC has received a standard SPCA education handout informing them of the possible offences that may have been committed under the AWA 1999 and advises of the penalties they may face under AWA
Education Letter	The owner or PIC has received a personalised SPCA education letter informing them of the welfare issues found and identifies possible offences that have been committed under the AWA 1999 and advises of the penalties they may face under AWA

Written Warning	SPCA has grounds to believe an offence has been committed for which a written warning is issued and a repeat will likely result in a prosecution in the future if a similar incident occurs again, however the owner or PIC does not formally acknowledge an offence has been committed
Formal Warning	The owner or PIC has formally acknowledged they committed an offence under the AWA 1999 and a repeat will likely result in a prosecution in the future if a similar incident occurs again. Formal Warning is issued by New Lynn Office
Infringement Notice	The owner or person in charge (PIC) has been issued an Infringement notice for breach of the AWA or Regulation
Court Order	Investigation resulted in a Court Order: TEO Temporary Enforcement Order, EO Enforcement Order, COC Court Order to Comply (for non- compliance of a EO or TEO) or a DO Disposal Order being issued
Prosecution (Act)	Investigation matter resulted in an Animal Welfare Act 1999 offence prosecution or a regulatory prosecution for an Animal Welfare (Care and Procedures) Regulations 2018 offence
