Purpose

- 1. This memo summarises draft proposals from the DPS Branch for the notional fund the Government is establishing to cover COVID-19 related expenses.
- These proposals have not yet been discussed by the Ministry's Executive Leadership Team or approved for submission by the Chief Executive, but are provided to support a conversation with you about your Covid Budget priorities at our officials meeting on Wednesday 22 April.

Background and Context

- Treasury issued a circular on 30 March 2020 providing guidance to Departments on a process for seeking funding in relation COVID-19 related expenses. Cabinet will consider a package on 11 May 2020.
- 4. Any funding sought in relation to COVID-19 expenses will need to meet the following criteria:
 - Funding is needed as a direct result of COVID-19;
 - Funding is needed outside of the normal budget cycle to support the response and/or recovery from COVID-19; and
 - The additional costs cannot be managed from existing baselines.
- 5. The DPS Branch has identified two categories of Covid-19-related costs:
 - initiatives where DIA has incurred direct costs in relation to the Covid-19 response for which it seeks reimbursement
 - initiatives that the GCDO could take to support the Covid-19 response and recovery.
- 6. We have also reached out to the critical services agencies we are supporting during the Covid-19 response, along with 14 non-critical services agencies, to assess whether GCDO could lodge digital initiatives on behalf of the whole system, or support digital initiatives from specific agencies. There does not appear to be a need for system-wide bids at this time, with most agencies targeting Budget 2021.
