Introduction

- 1. The Department of Internal Affairs (**Department**) has laid an information in the Hamilton District Court against 9(2)(a)
- 2. We wish to instruct you to represent the Department in this matter.

Background

- 3. The Department is prosecuting ^{9(2)(a)} on one charge of theft against section 219(1) of the Crimes Act 1961.
- 4. The charge relates to an incident at the Waikato Snooker and Eight Ball Club in Hamilton on 3 September 2012. The club is a class 4 venue with a number of electronic gaming machines.
- 5. On 3 September 2012, ^{9(2)(a)} visited the club. He played one of the machines and discovered that it was faulty. The nature of the fault was that, when a coin was placed into the machine, the machine would return the coin but would register a credit, effectively allowing credits to be amassed for free.
- 6. 9(2)(a) exploited this fault in order to amass a number of credits, which he then cashed out in total, he received \$980.
- When interviewed, ^{9(2)(a)} admitted the offending but disputed the amount obtained.

Prosecution

8. It has come to the Department's attention that ^{9(2)(a)} is currently on remand at Waikeria Prison in relation to charges laid by the New Zealand Police.



- 9. The Department has laid the charge with a first call date of 6 November 2012, which is 9(2)(a) s next call date on those other matters.
- 10. We wish to instruct you to appear for the Department on this matter.
- 11. The officer in charge of this file is Gambling Inspector Clark McMichael of the Hamilton Gambling Compliance Unit. Inspector McMichael will arrange delivery of the file directly to your office.

The Department of Internal Affairs (DIA) requests that Almao Douch Barristers and Solicitors represent them in the Hamilton District Court.

PANATION ACT 1982

The Hamilton Gambling Compliance Unit have laid an information (CRN: 12019502647) in the Hamilton District alleging the theft of \$980 cash by 9(2)(a) from the Waikato Snooker and Eight Ball Club, Hamilton on or about 3 September 2012.

The events are outlined in the attached summary of facts.

9(2)(a) is currently a remand prisoner at Waikeria Prison and is due to reappear on charges laid indictably by Police which include - conspiring to commit aggravated robbery, burglary and theft.

That hearing is set down for <u>Tuesday 6 November 2012</u> and is to be dealt with via an audio visual link from the prison.

The Department of Internal Affairs have summoned 9(2)(a) to the same date. (See the summons attached to this file)

WITNESSES and EVIDENCE

As a summary and in the event of a defended hearing, the Prosecution will call three witnesses and produce five exhibits. (Hearing time for the prosecution evidence is estimated at 2.5 hours)

WITNESS 1

• Waikato Snooker and Eight Ball Club Manager, 9(2)(a) has provided a statement detailing a fault in one of their electronic gaming machines occurring between 31 August and 3 September 2012. He will provide his calculations of the amount taken (\$980). He will also produce the Clubs video security footage showing 9(2)(a) actions and how the theft was being carried out. 9(2)(a) will provide further evidence showing that 9(2)(a) recorded false names in the Clubs visitor's book in an effort to conceal his identity.

WITNESS 2

 Evidence will be provided by a Gaming Inc Ltd service technician as to the nature of the machines fault and how it was rectified.

WITNESS 3

• I will provide evidence of how 9(2)(a) was identified as the suspect and how he was located and interviewed by myself on 5 October 2012. In his digitally recorded statement, 9(2)(a) admits to being in the Club and using the faulty EGM. He states: "I thought it was handing out money that's what I thought and so I grabbed it and went". He disputes the amount he obtained, claiming it was not the \$980 alleged but \$300.

The event happened around 12:01am 30/08/2012, a lady on machine #9 said that she saw a message come up on her machine that #3 had won the jackpot. However it did not show up on that machines credit meter.

Staff on the evening ran a DMA trying to determine this but nothing showed up on this report.

Staff took a note of everyone's phone numbers that was in the gaming room at the time the jackpot appeared to be struck.

The machine was shut down until a service technician could call in the next day.

How the fault was rectified and by whom

A service technician came in and as per the report fixed the address correctly and tested.

This was completed by Gaming Inc.

On the 30th of August a technician was able to complete a Jackpot report.

The amount does seemed to have been transposed and the adjustment that went through was \$943.81.

This possibly needs to be adjusted back the other way.

INVESTIGATION 2107233: Player dispute - Waikato Snooker and 8 Ball Club

Hamilton GCU received a complaint from 9(2)(a), 9(2)(ba)(i) of Hamilton who complained that whilst she was playing an EGM at the above club on 29 August 2012, the jackpot had been struck but not paid.

She questioned the process for determining the cause and wished confirmation that the matter had been dealt with appropriately.

My enquiries revealed that the jackpot was struck on the night of 29 August 2012 however due to the Jackpot controller not being linked to the EGM in question after an earlier repair, the payout figure was not displayed.

A Gaming Inc Technician was called the following day and the fault was rectified with the jackpot figure of \$934.81 established.

On 31 August 2012, the player concerned, 9(2)(a) was paid out the above amount.



Various visits to the venue (as disclosed in the attached jobsheets) confirmed that this was actually the case. In addition it is apparent that minors regularly accessed the premises also.

In conjunction with this investigation, an audit was commenced and will be completed shortly, the information uncovered in this investigation has been fed into the audit report and will also be fed into the current renewal round (their GM licence expired 30th November 2004).

SUMMARY OF FACTS

The Waikato Snooker and Eight Ball Club are located at 62 Rostrevor street Hamilton.

The club is a Class 4 gaming venue licensed by the Department of Internal Affairs to operate electronic gaming machines. (EGM's)

The electronic gaming machines are played by placing a two dollar coin into the machine which in turn places a credit on the machine allowing the player to play a game of chance.

Typically, a player can win cash during the course of play from the individual EGM and they also have the opportunity to strike a larger jackpot which accumulates from all EGM's at that venue.

During the afternoon of 3 September 2012, the defendant 9(2)(a) went to the club and using a false name, signed in as a social member.

He commenced playing one of the electronic gaming machines and quickly discovered that it was faulty.

When he placed a coin in, it would pass straight through the machine and fall into the payout tray, at the same time registering a credit.

The defendant, realising that this was to his advantage, quickly began to pass the same coin through the machine to amass credits he wasn't entitled too.

He continued to play the machine for an extended period of time receiving a number of 'wins' which were recorded as further credits.

At no time did the defendant bring the fault to the attention of the venue manager.

Towards the end of play he had accumulated a large number of credits on the machine. The credits were a combination of 'wins' from gambling and repeatedly passing the single coin through the EGM. After a period of time the defendant went to the clubs cashier, obtained cash for the credits and left.

In total, the defendant obtained \$980.00 in cash by exploiting the faulty machine.

9(2)(a) was spoken to by Gambling Inspectors from the Department on 5 October 2012.

He admitted playing the faulty machine and obtaining cash from it although he disputed the amount obtained.

An order for reparation is sought and is outlined hereunder.

The defendant <u>9(2)(a)</u> is unemployed, aged 21 years and at the time of this incident was residing in Hamilton.

He has previously appeared before the Courts.
