Official Information Act 1982 request

Thank you for your Official Information Act 1982 (OIA) request of 6 April 2021 regarding Family Court Protection Order applications. Your request was for the following:

I would like to request the number of Temporary protection orders filed and granted per year from 2010 and how many of those orders were discharged in a defended court hearing.

Interpretation

Please note that the Ministry of Justice (the Ministry) has interpreted your request for the number of Temporary Protection Orders:

- "filed" to mean the numbers of applications for Protection Orders filed; and
- "discharged" to mean the numbers of Discharge Protection Order applications granted.

Please note that a review of how Protection Order application information is recorded under the Family Violence Act 2018 is currently underway. Therefore, statistical information for July 2020 onwards is currently unavailable.
