Official Information Act request relating to the 'They Are Us' movie

Thank you for your Official Information Act 1982 (the Act) request, received on 14 June 2021. You requested:

"communications and briefings sent to and from you [the Prime Minister] and/or your office staff regarding the proposed film They Are Us sent, received or written in the time period up till 11 June 2021."

On Wednesday 9 June 2021 at 2:09 pm, the Deputy Chief Executive of Ministry for Culture and Heritage (MCH) made a phone call to the Private Secretary Arts, Culture and Heritage in this Office, notifying that MCH received advice from NZ Film Commission (NZFC) that a film relating to the March 15 attacks was being announced in the next 24-48 hours.

The following day on Thursday 10 June 2021 at 11:29 am, the Private Secretary Arts, Culture and Heritage made a phone call to NZFC requesting further information on the film. Following this phone call, this Office received an email from NZFC with the production's embargoed press release and backgrounder. I have decided to release this email chain to you with some information withheld under section 9(2)(a) of the Act, to protect the privacy of individuals.

Also in scope of your request are text messages between members of staff in this Office, which I have made the decision to withhold in full under section 9(2)(g)(i) of the act, to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through the free and frank expression of opinions by or between or to Ministers of the Crown or members of an organisation or officers and employees of any department or organisation in the course of their duty.

There are no briefings which have been identified within the scope of your request. Accordingly, this part of your request is refused under section 18(e) of the Act on the basis the document alleged to contain the information requested does not exist.

The Prime Minister has stated publicly that she had no prior knowledge or involvement of the film and confirmed that she only became aware of it following a message just prior to the announcement. You may wish to refer to the following media articles where the Prime Minister has discussed this:

THEY ARE US FEATURE FILM – BACKGROUNDER

This confidential document accompanies the embargoed press release for the *They Are Us* feature film project. The press release is embargoed until 7am Friday 11 June 2021 NZT. This document provides high level additional context on the project for MCH and the Prime Minister's Office and is not for wider distribution.

Project Outline:

They Are Us takes place during the week following the Christchurch attacks on New Zealand's Muslim community, and is an inspirational story about Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern's response to the tragic events, and the remarkable achievements of her government and citizens who rallied behind her message of compassion and unity to ban assault rifles in New Zealand.

Project Genesis:

Ayman Jamal spent an extended period of time living and working in Wellington when his feature film, *Bilal: A New Breed of Hero* was being post-produced at Park Road Post Production. Following the attacks in Christchurch, he developed the idea for the film and, as part of his research, met with the Imams of each of the Al Noor Mosque and Linwood Islamic Centre Mosque, as well as many of the survivors and family members of the victims.

Jamal advises that, as a Muslim himself, the way in which Prime Minister Ardern responded to this act of terrorism is what drew him to develop the project. He notes that in the past 40 years he has not seen conflict handled in the way Prime Minister Ardern did: An approach that moved swiftly from conflict to unity, shared humanity and the coming together of community.

Jamal then approached producer Stewart Till to collaborate on the project's development. Till determined from the outset that it was essential for the project to be created out of New Zealand in partnership with experienced New Zealand filmmakers. Andrew Niccol was invited on to the project and has since written more than six drafts of the screenplay. His narrative approach is to track the key events over the week after the attacks (i.e. Friday to Friday), closely following the actions of Prime Minister Ardern. Niccol's screenplay reflects his intention to neither show the gunman's face or name him, nor detail his livestream or manifesto. Philippa Campbell has joined the producing team as the New Zealand-based producer.

Andrew Niccol to Direct Rose Byrne as Jacinda Ardern in "They Are Us", FilmNation and CAA Media Finance Group Launching Sales at Cannes Virtual Market
