I refer to your email on 1 July 2021 to the Ministry for Business, Innovation and Employment requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following:

• The plan of action released in March to combat Modern Slavery included a \$50 million budget and a pledge to look at new laws. What discussions have there been surrounding the introduction of such an act and if there has been a draft of such a bill, can that be included in this document?

I have provided you with copies of these documents, except where the public interest in that information is outweighed by concerns about the release of that information.

Information has been withheld under the following grounds of the Act:

- Section 6(a) to avoid prejudicing the international relations of the Government of New Zealand
- Section 9(2)(a) to protect the privacy of natural persons
- Section 9(2)(a) to protect the confidentiality of advice tendered by officials

• Section 9(2)(g)(i) – to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through the free and frank expression of opinions to Ministers of the Crown

Your request for a draft bill has been refused under section 18(e) of the Act, on the grounds that the document you have requested does not exist.
