Statement

The Ministry of Health has now approved a formal request for the transfer and treatment of a patient from Fiji who has tested positive for Covid-19.

The Ministry's approval follows Middlemore Hospital agreeing to treat the patient, and a transfer plan approved by the Medical Officer of Health from the Auckland Regional Public Health Service and agreed to by New Zealand Air Ambulance Service. The plan takes into consideration the safety of both the patient and the crew who will be transporting the patient. Middlemore Hospital also has an isolation plan in place for the patient.

Approval follows a request from the United Nations to New Zealand for transfer and treatment of the patient. The patient is a United Nations employee working in Suva, Fiji.

Flight plans are yet to be confirmed, but it is expected the flight will arrive on Wednesday.

Any patient coming from Fiji, or any other country, would be covered by protocols to protect against the risk of spread of COVID-19. Strong protocols are in place to manage the risk of transferring the patient.

The United Nations will be meeting the cost of both the medevac and treatment of the patient.

No further information is being provided at this stage.

Hi team,

I think we need to get around the table to discuss this today - as a request for a formal medevac arrangement is a step up on what we currently have. Attached is my/Desmond's latest thoughts on medevac advice. But it is not inconceivable that we need to rethink options due to the COVID-19 situation in Fiji? Please circulate my upcoming invitation more broadly as you see fit.

Points that it would be good to get clarity on from colleagues:

Is a formal agreement International SOS between New Zealand's Permanent Mission in New York and UN's COVID Taskforce necessary before recommending service providers and hospitals in New Zealand? UNHC/DEVPP colleagues you may be able to comment on this. From the FM I assume the normal process is for the medical care provider to work directly with New Zealand DHBs to set up an arrangement to facilitate a medevac to New Zealand. Or in other words, do we need to insert ourselves into what is normally a matter between DHBs and insurance

companies/medical care providers. However, I also recognise the pressure that colleagues in Fiji will be feeling – and that the only reliable air link out of Fiji being the weekly Air New Zealand flight to Auckland. We will need to be able to provide good guidance for our post. I think we also need to bring in Brenda Hynes to these conversations - I will reach out to her separately.

Once we have a position established amongst ourselves, a zoom call with post/UN stakeholders seems like a good idea.

Welcome all thoughts at the upcoming meeting.

Medevac Application Process

This process covers all cases where the applicant's reason for exemption from staying in Managed Isolation is based on the passenger coming into New Zealand and needing to go straight into hospital on arrival. A medevac patient could arrive <u>either</u> on a commercial flight <u>or</u> private provider like Air Ambulance.

For the purpose of this document, the person coming in on the medevac flight who requires medical treatment will be referred to as the patient.

NOTE: There is often a medical attendant who travels with the patient. They are exempt as per COVID-19 Public Health Response (Air Border) Order 2020 clause 11B.

This process relates to the diagram attached here:

1.	Receive email or phone call for a medevac	 Receive application to the medevacs@health.govt.nz Receive a phone call regarding a medical situation
2.	Is the application for a medevac?	 If 'yes' go to step 4, if 'no' go to step 3 A medevac application is for a patient who requires urgent care and will go straight into hospital on arrival instead of a MIF (see step 3 for definitions of additional potential applications). Medevacs are only to be processed if received from the DHB or air ambulance service. If the application has come through any other avenue this may not be a medevac. Some medevac applications can come from insurance companies. The insurance company will need to arrange for an accepting DHB (suggest they contact ADHB or CMDHB for further information, or speak with the current treating doctor). Add the application into Salesforce to generate the application number.
3.	Identify the correct application type and follow the process	 Additional types of applications: Visa Support Letter: Patient <u>can</u> complete 14 days of managed isolation and are going to either a publicly funded hospital or a private hospital for treatment once they have completed managed isolation. This treatment will still need to be completed with some urgency. SEE <u>VISA SUPPORT PROCESS</u>.
		 Exemption for medical reasons: <u>Either</u> the patient can go into a MIF on arrival and will need a pass out to attend an appointment or treatment <u>or</u> they feel they a medical reason for not staying in a MIF. Visa support letter

This process covers all cases where the applicant requires a support letter from the Ministry of Health to get a visa to come into New Zealand for medical treatment. These are usually not medevacs, the person is going straight into hospital on arrival. The applicant can usually do two weeks in a managed isolation facility before needing the medical treatment.

For the purpose of this document the person coming to New Zealand needing medical treatment will be referred to as the patient

This process relates to the diagram attached here:

1.	Application for visa support	 Receive application to the medevacs@health.govt.nz Determine what type on application it is. I.e Medevac, Medical or Visa support. Visa support requests can come from a DHB, a private doctor or facility, the applicant directly or a family member of that applicant. If the application has come for the person directly or as family member, they may not know they are after a visa support letter, talk to them about what they are wanting to do once they land in New Zealand and if they have or need a visa. This is need as currently NZI requires approval form a DHB or MOH to provide a visa, if the person is getting treatment privately they will require the support from MOH. The application does not need to go into Salesforce
2.	Is the application for a visa support letter?	If 'yes' go to step 4, if 'no' go to step 3
3.	Forward to relevant team for handling	 The application is not based on the applicant needing a visa support letter Talk to the patient about what they are requesting and direct them to the right place, i.e. MBIE isolation exemptions isolationexemptions@mbie.govt.nz.
4.	Are the requirements satisfied?	 In order to process the application, the application must provide the following details. Passport information for patient and any support person accompanying them Referral letter from a doctor in their home county Letter of acceptance from a doctor in New Zealand Guarantee of payment of all costs including their time in a managed isolation facility We often get requests for people who are pregnant, there needs to be proof or justification that they can not receive the medical treatment that the require in the country they are currently living. If we have all the required information go to step 6, if not go to step 5
5.	Seek required information from the application source	 Email the application source to seek further information or clarification as needed. Go to step 6

6.	Is there a support person present?	If 'yes' go to step 7, if no go to step 8
7.	Is there a need for the support person?	 There will usually be a line in the acceptance letter stating that the patient will require the support of the support person upon discharge. A support person is someone who is needed to provide physical, emotional or mental support before during or after treatment. The patient usually has to stay in New Zealand for and extended period of time after getting the medical treatment. It is not up to MOH to decide the clinical need for a support person. If there are multiple support people requesting to be on the visa support letter, you can go back to the accepting doctor to ask if there would be any need to x amount of support people.
8.	Write support letter	Write the visa support letter, there is a template for this in the medevacs email and in lotus notes under process.
9.	Get approval for the letter	 During the week send the finished letter to Brenda Hynes for approval. If Brenda is not working or it is the weekend send the letter to the on-call manager. Brenda's signature will still be on the bottom of the letter unless other wise stated. You will usually just get an email back saying approved.
10.	Send approved letter off	 Send the approved letter off to the original sender, <u>APSSO@mbie.govt.nz</u> and <u>Rigcoord@nmf.nz</u>. You will need to let the RIQ coordination team know of any special requirement the patient will need while they are in a MIF If the patient needs urgent medical treatment while in a MIF the facility will follow protocols and the person will get medical treatment as needed. Make sure you PDF the letter before sending it.
11.	No further action required	File the letter in lotus notes case management filing system and make the task in response, if it was put into EMIS there, as completed

DEVPP's view is that there are three components to this question. The first paragraph regarding Amelia is best managed by Health. We also think that Health is best placed to provide details on New Zealand's arrangements and agreements with Pacific nations to accept medevacs.

We think that it might be useful to also provide some information on the medical treatment scheme, given the question also asks for information on New Zealand's arrangements and agreements with Pacific nations, so we propose the final paragraph be added to Ministry of Health's response:

{insert MOH language on medivacs}

Then add: The Medical Treatment Scheme also occasionally supports MEDEVACs from the Pacific to New Zealand. This scheme normally supports non-urgent medical transfers from Tonga, Fiji, Tuvalu, and Vanuatu (Samoa also have a similar scheme with New Zealand). Countries nominate patients who meet certain medical criteria to be transferred to a New Zealand health facility for treatment unavailable in their home country. Costs are paid out of the NZ aid budget, and may include a caregiver, MIQ costs, a stipend and accommodation while recovering after discharge and pending repatriation, pharmaceutical and allied treatment costs. Each country is allocated an annual budget for these transfers and prioritise their patients accordingly.
