Thank you for your request for information dated 4 August 2021.

Total number of Parking Infringements issued and the associated revenue collected.

For the period 1 July 2020 to 30 June 2021 572,031 infringements were issued. The revenue generated was \$21,502,534. Please note that this is not the actual income received by Auckland Transport.

List of the top 10 Parking Wardens in terms of infringements and revenue issued in the past year. We do not require names to protect them from harassment. Only their badge number, total number of tickets he/she issued and the associated revenue earned, and total number of illegally parked vehicles towed (if applicable). Please include their tenure.

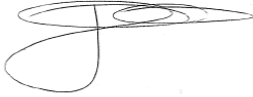
