In terms of the hui, I thought the discussion went well and that we have a shared vision for the future that supports both iwi longer-term development aspirations and also the safety outcomes the Agency is seeking to implement at Te Ngae Junction.

- 2. Confirm your approval for Engineers to access NKRC land to complete non-intrusive topographical survey and site walkovers for ecological assessments (roundabout and Waiohewa bridge underpass investigations).
- 3. Confirm your approval for contractor and consultant access to NKRC land for construction purposes (roundabout and potential path construction) in the new year.
  - a. Subject to confirmation of construction funding and further design delays, we currently have construction scheduled for commencement in February 2022 and concluding in November 2022.

As discussed Waka Kotahi NZTA would like to enter iwi property for investigative purposes to assist in the design of the project.

The purposes are non-invasive, that is they do not disturb the land and will involve contractors walking over the site to carry out the investigations. Typical purposes are topographical survey and site walkovers for ecological assessments that may include assessing wetland extents, vegetation, birds, lizards, bats and freshwater environments, if present. This may include assessing vegetation types and species, habitat assessments, sampling of habitats, macroinvertebrates, fish and water quality within freshwater environments.

If monitoring equipment is required to be left on site typically for ecological or noise monitoring, we will enter into a simple letter agreement with you.

Can you please advise us of any hazards on site that we should be aware of.

Waka Kotahi will carry out the visits in a manner to create as little disturbance as possible, at a time convenient to you and under your direction. They will make good any damage in the unlikely event this occurs. It is envisaged the investigations will be carried out over 6 months and we will give at least 48 hours' notice before arranging a time to come onsite.
