- 1. Are you able to supply the number of employees, and;

As of 31 August 2021, Manatū Taonga has 167 employees. Regarding your second request, we do not capture this information as it up to individual kaimahi as to whether they adopt the use of pronouns into their email signatures. However, the Ministry does encourage the use of the pronouns in email signatures, and provides guidance to kaimahi on our intranet.
