Prior to the beginning of the meeting those present agreed that Jannitta Pilisi would be the Acting Chairperson for the purpose of this meeting.

1. Welcome and apologies

The meeting was opened by Jannitta Pilisi with a prayer.

The two new Advisory Trustees were welcomed and all those present at the meeting introduced themselves. Kim's experience as a former Foundation North trustee and Ruth's accounting experience were noted with enthusiasm.

Apologies were received from Brenda Wraight.

2. Confirmation of previous minutes

The minutes of the Pacific Development and Conservation Trust (Trust) meeting held on 25 November 2019 were confirmed as a true and accurate record.

3. Matters Arising

There were no matters arising from the minutes of the previous meeting.

4. Accountability reports received – separate spreadsheet

One of the longer-serving Advisory Trustees explained the purpose of the Accountability Reports. The Advisory Trustees noted the accountability reports received and those not yet due.

One of the Advisory Trustees asked if there had been any negative feedback from groups declined at the last meeting. Joanne said there had not been any negative feedback but several groups had contacted her for further clarification of the decision reason and that had been provided.

The Advisory Trustees commented on one grant where numerous attempts to contact the group had been unsuccessful and asked what the next steps were. Joanne Becker and Joe Grace explained the Department of Internal Affairs process for grant write-offs. It was suggested by the Advisory Trustees that a Pacific Head of Mission may be in a position to provide some project feedback.

ACTION: Sai Lealea to contact the appropriate Solomon Islands Pacific Head of Mission for feedback on the progress of the Ngwaelalida Water Tank Project.

5. Funds available for distribution

The Advisory Trustees noted that \$155,497 unspent from the previous financial year (2019/2020) was carried over to the new financial year (2020/2021) which starts today. That \$155,497 was due to be allocated at the meeting scheduled to happen in March 2020 but was postponed due to COVID-19.

This \$155,497 has been added to the normal allocation of \$250,000 that would have been available for the allocation meetings in 2020/2021.

This means that this year there are technically three allocation meetings.

6. Declarations of Conflicts of interest

There were no declared conflicts of interest.

7. 2019/20 PDCT second funding round requests

The Advisory Trustees considered 45 applications for funding. Of the 45 applications, 10 applications were recommended for funding totalling \$160,424 and 35 applications were recommended for decline. The Advisory Trustees' recommendations and comments are set out in the Recommendation Schedule, attached as an Appendix to these minutes.

8. Date of next meeting – before 25 November 2020

The date of the next meeting would be confirmed by early October 2019 following the appointment of another Advisory Trustee. However, those present confirmed they would likely be available to meet on Friday 6 November 2020.

9. General Business

At 3.00pm two former Advisory Trustees, Peter Kiely and Bevan Killick joined the meeting so they could be farewelled by those Advisory Trustees present at the meeting. The former Advisory Trustees welcomed the new Trustees, spoke of the good work done by the Trust and thanked staff. Current Trustees praised the leadership of the former Chairperson and Bevan's specialist accounting knowledge.

The Secretariat flagged these items for discussion at this meeting.

- a. Online system
- b. Future meetings

The future meetings issue was discussed earlier in the meeting.

Joe Grace explained that, due to former Advisory Trustees' frequent travel to places with poor, unstable or very expensive internet connections PDCT has been using work-arounds instead of the full functionality of the online system.

He wondered whether the Advisory Trustees would like, after training, to utilise all the features of the online grants and customer management system. The Advisory Trustees agreed to this, with the proviso that the current work-around would still be an option if required. Joe agreed and advised that DIA staff would be in touch to set up training later in the year.

ACTION: DIA Staff to train Advisory Trustees to use the review features of the grants and customer management system before the November 2020 meeting.

The meeting concluded at 5.10pm after participants were thanks for their contributions and a karakia from Jannitta.

3. Matters Arising

3.1 GCMS

Trustees discussed the issues they had had in using the GCMS system. The following issues were identified:

- Order of the applications

- Not been able to find the next application on the list after submitting a reviewed application. This resulted in some applications not been reviewed by some Trust members.
- The preview function did not work well.
- Some of Brenda's comments had been recorded against the wrong application.
- Difficulty of not been able to identify the application locality or region.

The Trustees appreciated seeing a spreadsheet of members comments before the meeting.

ACTION: DIA staff to enquire whether it was possible to list the applications by region in GCMS.

Where groups provided a scanned version of their application with pages in separate files, DIA staff were asked if it was possible to combine pages so they are viewing the application in one file, instead of across several files.

Sai suggested a refresher on GCMS could be organised before the next Advisory Trustees meeting.
