

We are not required to let GTC know but in the interests of an ongoing relationship I think it is advisable. Since Council authorised the release of the documents requested in 2016 there are no grounds to redact anything and the content of the report is high level but it is possible that

will twist it so we just need to be aware and prepared for that, as do GTC. Of course

that is your decision though. In theory the memo that went with the report could be withheld but its content does not justify it being withheld. I have checked my electronic file and cannot find a report or reference to a report being written dated 22 February 2016. Although it would be advisable to explain the reference to a report that does not exist as a typo when it is released.

I have attached an email with a press release making the information public in 2016. I do not have confirmation that it was published. In my view as a first step $\frac{7(2)}{(a)}$ really needs to be referred to the commissioners recommendations report which will give him the full - and accurate - background which includes setting out the

modelling history, including peer review history - and the nature of Save Our Hills evidence and the commissioners independent assessment of its credibility. This is available on our website. There is a very long backstory and I think it is entirely appropriate to ask him to avail himself of that information as his starting point. It should assist him to get the SOH claims into proper context. It will, hopefully, also make it clear to him that there is no credible story here.

Peter, if you need a bullet point summary of this modelling history (which is likely to involve a simple cut and paste of relevant parts of the commissioners report), then leading onto the environment court appeal process, then James would be the best starting point to organise this for you. Suffice it to say the modelling has been extensively tested and peer reviewed and SOH's expert at the hearing stage actually raised only marginal and ambiguous issue with the modelling work. Then on appeal, SOH were unwilling to expose their then 2 experts to expert conferencing to test their views, and indeed we never go to know what the second expert actually thought at all. My own strong suspicion is that neither were willing to support

7(2)(a) position and knew that if they tried to this would be exposed as unsustainable at expert conferencing. SOH then withdrew their appeal when it was clear that they could not proceed without proper examination between experts and would not be able to present a layperson's view of the modelling.

Matters included the accuracy of the maps and the impact of development in the upper reaches of the Pinehaven catchment.

You will find commentary around the issue of hydraulic neutrality for development in the Pinehaven Catchment Overlay to ensure that stormwater runoff be at a rate no greater than when compared to the pre-development situation.

Save Our Hills appealed the original decision made by Council on this plan change and a copy of its appeal can be read here:

Save Our Hills subsequently withdrew its appeal against PC 42. A copy of the Minute from the Environment Court acknowledging this is included in last night's Council report.

As both appeals were resolved, Council approved the plan change as per the Order from the Court, and will make it operative in the coming weeks.

Future development

In relation to your questions about the status of development in the area, the development of the Southern Growth Area was signalled in our Land Use Strategyhttps://www.upperhuttcity.com/Your-Council/Plans-policies-bylaws-and-reports/Strategies/Land-Use-Strategy as being required to meet long-term housing demand.

In my view as a first step [7(2)] really needs to be referred to the commissioners recommendations report which will give him the full - and accurate - background which includes setting out the modelling history, including peer review history - and the nature of Save Our Hills evidence and the commissioners independent assessment of its credibility. This is available on our website. There is a very long backstory and I think it is entirely appropriate to ask him to avail himself of that information as his starting point. It should assist him to get the SOH claims into proper context. It will, hopefully, also make it clear to him that there is no credible story here.

Peter, if you need a bullet point summary of this modelling history (which is likely to involve a simple cut and paste of relevant parts of the commissioners report), then leading onto the environment court appeal process, then James would be the best starting point to organise this for you. Suffice it to say the modelling has been extensively tested and peer reviewed and SOH's expert at the hearing stage actually raised only marginal and ambiguous issue with the modelling work. Then on appeal, SOH were unwilling to expose their then 2 experts to expert conferencing to test their views, and indeed we never go to know what the second expert actually thought at all. My own strong suspicion is that neither were willing to support $\frac{7(2)(a)}{(2)(a)}$ position and knew that if they tried to this would be exposed as unsustainable at expert conferencing. SOH then withdrew their appeal when it was clear that they could not proceed without proper examination between experts and would not be able to present a layperson's view of the modelling.

Trust this assists. James, to note at this stage please.

Hi Richard / James,

On the back of our conversation last week regarding UDC greenfield feasibility results, I've pulled together some of the results to help illustrate how they stack up against our current and previous assumptions.

Below you'll find a link to an updated chart showing feasibility results for select greenfield sites. Here you can see a number of figures, which I've described below:

- * UDC Council Estimate this is based on a static density applied over the entire site. Density is based on current densities calculated in existing urban areas which are of similar typology which we would expect may be applied in Greenfield sites. This ranges from 9 to 22 dwellings per hectare.
- * UDC Sensitivity Test Here MRCagney have tested if different densities throughout the site are economically viable to test what the most economically viable densities are for each sites (e.g. dynamic density). Densities of between 10 to 30 dwellings per hectare are tested.
- * Council/Sensitivity 50% Moderated while some sites had marked differences between static and dynamic density results, from a planning perspective, some of these densities are unrealistic. I have therefore added an additional bar which simply applies 50% of the difference between static and dynamic results to assist in estimating a result which may be more realistic.
- * LUS this simply shows what the estimates were in the 2016 Land Use Strategy for applicable Greenfield sites (Appendix 2).

Lastly, in our discussion we talked about what impact this may have on the Southern Growth Area (SGA). Given we now have this layer showing areas which are feasible, I have intersected this against proposed reserve areas, draft SNA sites, and draft landscape layers.

Overall, you'll notice that SNAs and Landscape layers are largely contained within proposed reserve areas, however there is some intrusion into the feasible development layer along the southern proportion. This predominantly intersects with the draft SAL landscape. In that respect, I think this brings into question what our duties are to discuss this further in terms of overall expectations with the site and planning policy development.

On the back of our conversation last week regarding UDC greenfield feasibility results, I've pulled together some of the results to help illustrate how they stack up against our current and previous assumptions.

Below you'll find a link to an updated chart showing feasibility results for select greenfield sites. Here you can see a number of figures, which I've described below:

- * UDC Council Estimate this is based on a static density applied over the entire site. Density is based on current densities calculated in existing urban areas which are of similar typology which we would expect may be applied in Greenfield sites. This ranges from 9 to 22 dwellings per hectare.
- * UDC Sensitivity Test Here MRCagney have tested if different densities throughout the site are economically viable to test what the most economically viable densities are for each sites (e.g. dynamic density). Densities of between 10 to 30 dwellings per hectare are tested.
- * Council/Sensitivity 50% Moderated while some sites had marked differences between static and dynamic density results, from a planning perspective, some of these densities are unrealistic. I have therefore added an additional bar which simply applies 50% of the difference between static and dynamic results to assist in estimating a result which may be more realistic.
- * LUS this simply shows what the estimates were in the 2016 Land Use Strategy for applicable Greenfield sites (Appendix 2).

Lastly, in our discussion we talked about what impact this may have on the Southern Growth Area (SGA). Given we now have this layer showing areas which are feasible, I have intersected this against proposed reserve areas, draft SNA sites, and draft landscape layers.

Overall, you'll notice that SNAs and Landscape layers are largely contained within proposed reserve areas, however there is some intrusion into the feasible development layer along the southern proportion. This predominantly intersects with the draft SAL landscape. In that respect, I think this brings into question what our duties are to discuss this further in terms of overall expectations with the site and planning policy development.

I'm wondering if I could use some of your contract evaluation skills??

We have just received the proposal for the Status Quo CBA for PC50 from Sense Partners. Unsurprisingly, the proposal is for a fairly hefty sum (>\$87k), but is also comprehensive in its scope and expertise. I'm generally happy with their approach and methodology, however have some questions regarding:

- The inclusion of business zoning assessment;
- Framing the scope as a proposal, rather than status quo evaluation;
- Re-creating data which is (or will be) generated through the UDC, namely:

- o Population projections (our preference is to apply the UDC results)
- o Residential land sufficiency (AKA 'Development Capacity' which will be available roughly the end of next month)
- o Business and employment projections (which is already captured in Business Demand reporting completed by Sense Partners).

Overall, my hope is that by leveraging off these results we can reduce the total cost, but I guess this will depend on the compatibility of data with their modelling.

For your reference, the broad purpose of this report is to create a baseline of costs and benefits of the current DP as a means for comparison against a (future) preferred option later down the track. It is hoped that this status quo CBA may also help identify specific provisions which are inefficient or creating adverse outcomes, and which may be addressed through the PC50 policy development.

It would be great if you could please cast your eye over the attached and let me know your thoughts. But please let me know if you're under the pump and don't think you don't have any time.

My apologies for not getting back to you sooner. Thank you for your letter last week outlining your general approach at this point for the Status Quo CBA. I've had a read through and the points you raise all seem valid. Regarding the population data, we would remised not to use the UDC residential demand figures produced.

In terms of other examples, I have managed to track-down the Waikato DP review example. What they appear to have done is first go through a process to identify what their options for Residential review are, discuss that with the community, and then run a CBA on their preferred option only. For us to run a status quo CBA would arguably be novel, but I think we're prepared to be trend-setters, and think it will give us a good roadmap for issue identification.

Their CBA was conducted by Market Economics and breaks-down each objective and policy (not rules) in terms of costs and benefits from an economic, social, biophysical, and cultural effects basis, while also dividing these up by direct process effects, consequent effects, and the nature of

effects.

The overall assessment table does not detail monetary costs and benefits (but does split market and non-market values), however does appear to have a monetary input basis. It looks as though they have mapped areas across the district where each policy will have effects, assessing values of properties within catchments, and detailing the effect of the policy as a share of the overall district. No doubt there are other calculations beyond these tables which are not detailed verbatim in the report.

The report references the Social and Economic profile done for the area. I am still waiting on Waikato DC to come back to me with the full report, but an addendum report is available herehttp://openwaikato.co.nz/attachments/wd-social-and-economic-profile-addendum-huntly-ward.pdf.

We have yet to have a discussion internally whether we would anticipate something of this scale for the CBA status quo, but am sure something of this scale would be appropriate once we consider our options (perhaps only being a single option CBA, like WDC). In the meantime, it might be good for you to familiarise yourself with this CBA methodology and see if you had any thoughts on its suitability for our CBA work.

I hope to have a further discussion with Angela on this next week and hope to get back to you then.

Yes, it was great to catch-up last week and discuss the overall project and we're looking forward to seeing how this initial stage develops.

Despite my confidence in the assumption that Kapiti had undertaken a CBA in their DP review, it does appear that they notified their plan change prior to the RMA being updated to add more onerous requirements of an economic CBA. That being the case, their s32 report for the

Residential Chapter is brief and has no economic CBA. However, I have since discovered that Waikato have very recently notified their DP review and do include an economic CBA. I have requested a copy and will forward this on when I receive it.

In the meantime, I thought I might give you an idea of the specific areas which we may include in any future CBA. As we discussed, any review of growth areas will be based off those identified in the Land Use Strategyhttps://upperhuttcity.com/wp-content/uploads/2016/09/UH-LUS-Draft-FINAL-V10.pdf. Page 72 provides a map of the district showing areas of intended to have intensification and where edge expansion is likely to occur. The following pages (up to p 86) describe how these are intended to be developed.

Two important things to note with this is how we see the R/R Review giving effect to this. Firstly, the Gillespies Road site is already zoned Residential, but will still need to be reviewed for appropriateness of zoning. This site suffers from a number of access and natural hazard constraints. Secondly, the Southern Growth Area site is extensive and complex. It is for this reason that the zoning of this site is not intended to be reviewed as part of this plan change.

Like we discussed, at this stage we see the CBA project being twofold: it would first evaluate the status quo of the DP remaining the same, and at a later stage, once issues have been further refined, another CBA would be done for all of the various review options. These options have yet to be defined, but are broadly anticipated to revolve around options to intensify, to develop expansion sites, or a combination of both.

It is early days, but what would be good to know from you is what specific information you need to help inform the first stage CBA. We gave you a brief run-down of what the DP chapters control, but am happy to provide any additional detail you need.

Nice to hear from you! Sounds like you have been busy!

Thanks for thinking of us. The work you outline would certainly be something Sense Partners would be interesting in completing for you.

I did have a couple of questions/comments.

First, I wasn't crystal clear on what you refer to as "of a similar scale". Do you expect the CBA to be a similar

scale to the residential component of the UDC report? I might well have that wrong but if you can send me something on the size of work you are expecting that would be helpful.

Second, you gave me a sense of the size of the area affected by change (which appears large) but knowing a little more about the potential scale of change would be helpful: are these large interventions or not particularly material. I know the CBA will seek to uncover that but there is a substantive difference between very minor changes to the regs everywhere and material changes.

Speaking hypothetically, we would likely work with some existing studies and figures (I expect you have access to residential equivalents of the business demand work I completed earlier in the year for example and potentially more granular data), apply methodologies we have used elsewhere and then have to consider more nuanced ways to think about some of the spatial effects/benefits.

In terms of costs, it's hard to know without knowing much more on the magnitude of the plan changes.

One way to help gauge potential costs could be to scale against the business land report we completed for the five councils (including GWRC).

The three stages of the 136 page report plus exec summaries etc cost \$145,000 ex GST. My sense is that you are after something that might require

half that resourcing, less charting, but more rigour on the costs and potential benefits. I'm aware that the plan can be subject to legal challenge so more

than ever, we need to be rigorous and transparent to others on methods. We can also operate on a time and materials basis (although materials are likely to low or zero) if that worked better from you perspective.

But perhaps rather than speculating it may well prove more productive to meet up. I have good availability as early as next week but have intermittent commitments from then. I was luckily enough to have my first visit to Panhead and Boneface Breweries last weekend so am more than happy to come out to Upper Hutt and talk even, if not over a beer at this stage.

Hope you're well. The UHCC Policy Planning team are currently in the scoping stages of the Rural and Residential Chapters Review of our District Plan, set to begin next year. The review will largely be giving effect to the result of the residential component of the UDC Report and is likely to take some years to complete.

Given it's scale and complexity, it is envisioned that this will require an economic cost benefit analysis of a similar scale (in line with s32 of the RMA). We wondered whether or not this is something that Sense Partners would be able to assist with?

To provide you with some context for scope, the Plan Change is likely to update all land use and subdivision considerations for rural and residential areas across the Upper Hutt District. This means it is likely to directly influence landowner's ability to develop their own land, as well as additional new residentially zoned areas to cater for growing housing demand.

If this is something that Sense Partners would be able to assist with, it would be beneficial to know the estimated delivery time and estimated cost of such a report. Keep in mind that this is not a request for a fixed quote, but merely to assist in current and future conversations for project scoping and timeline development.







Hi Geoff, a few comments.

P1 - intro, first para the change in economy is also supported by increasing numbers of people employed as professionals, managers, and community and professional service workers.

p5 2.2 bulletpoints (and subsequent pages) - note also the impact of increased impermeable surfaces on stormwater discharges, change from manufacturing towards craft breweries and other industries that continue to increase demand on water supply.

P5 changes in demographics - delete first para, and replace with 'between 2006 and 2013 the Upper Hutt population increased by 1,764 (an increase of 4.5%?) and the 2017 estimated resident population is 42,600.

P5 The Land Use Strategy. I'm unsure if the prediction of 41,000 by 2021 is correct (especially if we're now at 42,600) and the subsequent para states 'this level of population growth has not come to pass' (I suggest deleting these words).

P6 Maymorn, the LUS assumes a yield of 220 lots, not 1700. Likewise, the LUS was finalised in 2016, so I'm unsure what potential revision of the LUS this comment may be referring to "if Council agrees to include this as a greenfield area in the updated Urban Growth Strategy")

P29 the assumptions that 'there will be minimal impact on Council services during the lifetime of this strategy as a result of the implementation of the LUS' - I'm unsure whether this should refers to level of service? Given the likely impact that 4923 extra houses could have on services.

In light of these comments, I'm struggling to ascertain whether the LUS assumptions are actually factored into this strategy, the above sentiments infer that, if it is, it isn't viewed with credibility. There doesn't appear to be acknowledgement of 760 dwellings at Gillespies Rd (which would require a new bridge), or 1000 dwellings in the southern growth area at Guildford (10-30 years). It might be that they don't have any infrastructure consequence, but it would be good to have a table that presents key changes in a similar format to appendix 2 of the LUS to confirm.

I do acknowledge that the LUS fulfils Council's statutory obligation under the NPS on urban development capacity - ensuring that Council is able to be able to accommodate growth, and this might include an element of overforecasting.

Sorry for the delay in responding, have had a busy week as I approach my finish date on Friday. Couple of things re your points in yellow:

BUPA - it's probably OK to include this. We know for sure that the demand for retirement facilities is not going to diminish any time soon, and all the providers are in expansion mode. BUPA already own the land, so some sort of development there is inevitable. As long as it's not specifically identifiable, that should be OK.

CIT - just waiting to hear back from someone who knows more about this as to the arrangement/tenure of dwellings. Will hopefully have an answer in the next day or so.

Brentwood - in terms of your calculation of density, 15dw/ha is low - we rarely see new development in the existing urban areas coming in with site sizes much above the minimum permitted by the District Plan.

Thinking back, the way we assessed capacity at Brentwood for the Land Use Strategy was

different from other areas. With large vacant areas, we start by subtracting a percentage of the land area for provision of roads, utilities, parks etc, before dividing the balance up for housing. We did not do this for the Brentwood capacity assessment, because the layout of the place is already determined and we are just anticipating development and redevelopment of existing lots. So the yield calculation was done based on analysis of the capacity of existing land parcels. Of all the sites we forecast, Brentwood probably had the most detailed analysis based on the individual parcels of land, District Plan allowances and likely outcomes based on our knowledge of common development patterns.

We agree it's likely that there will be demolition in that area - Housing NZ have now indicated they are likely to sell their land in Brentwood so any redevelopment will have market economics to the fore. The housing stock is not particularly good quality and the opportunity for private developers to make more money with increased density developments will be attractive. We feel it's quite unlikely that new development will be at the same low intensity as the surrounding area so this is probably not an ideal baseline for future projection. And the newly adopted LUS promotes intensification in the existing urban areas. I understand your logic, but just wanted to fill you in on the methodology used to arrive at our prediction, which we do feel has a better-than-usual degree of accuracy.

Maymorn

This is the map from the adopted LUS - the one you're referring to is from the consultation draft. The 220 dwellings refers to the potential capacity of the green blob, which has been calculated as part of the previous work done for the Maymorn Structure Plan.

Thanks for your recent presentation - Forecast.id is going to be a fantastic tool for us and we're looking forward to having it up and running.

Firstly, do you have the latest copy of the Land Use Strategy? It was adopted on September 21 so is now official Council policy. You can access a copy online here:

http://www.upperhuttcity.com/planning/urban-growth-strategy/

Page 119 (the last page!) will be of interest to you - it has our estimate of the spatial distribution of housing over the next 30 years. Further discussion of these sites can be found in the housing chapter pages 58-91.

In answer to your questions:

* Kingsley Drive future development - will there be environmental protection constraints to the land allowed for development? Can this be provided on a map and I will adjust capacity of development accordingly.

Earlier during preparation of the Land Use Strategy we did have additional capacity signalled. However, we have recently conducted a city-wide investigation into outstanding natural features/landscapes (as required by the Regional Policy Statement) and the land to the west of the existing residential development at Kingsley Heights has been identified as being a potential significant natural area. We therefore moved from signalling some capacity in the Land Use

Strategy to signalling none due to the likelihood that a large part of this land will be recognised and considered unsuitable for residential development. Realistically, the capacity is just what's available by way of existing vacant consented residential sites or as infill on larger sites. Work on the SNA Plan Change has already started, but will ramp up in early 2017 and run through to the end of 2018 so there will be no indication until after then as to whether there is expansion capacity at Kingsley Heights.

Your estimates of King Charles Drive residual therefore look OK, but Kingsley Heights expansion needs to be removed from the predictions altogether.

* Trentham - AgResearch site is apparently only one part of a development which will extend further southwest? Is there any more information on this or at least an extent with possible masterplan assumptions re: density/proposed land use?

The AgResearch site at Wallaceville was recently the subject of a Plan Change. The Structure Plan for the site is included in chapter 39 of the District Plan: http://www.upperhuttcity.com/wp-content/uploads/2014/09/DP-Ch39-Wallaceville.pdf Development on the site will be staged - Areas A and B can be seen on the map at the end of the above chapter.

The total area of the site is approximately 63 hectares, and the developer's estimate of yield is 700 dwellings. Area A is estimated to yield around 550 dwellings. Development of this area has already started, with a subdivision consent for 65 residential allotments already issued and earthworks started. So this area is coming on stream now and it's likely that we could start to see CCCs picking up early next financial year.

In terms of Area B, as some details were not finalised at the time when the Wallaceville Structure Plan was adopted, Area B is subject to an additional information requirement for resource consent applications to provide a spatial layout plan. So it will lag behind Area A. The area is estimated to yield around 150 dwellings, and the developer has advised that parts of this area are expected to come on stream from later next year. In terms of when we might start to see CCCs, from 5 years might be a reasonable expected time for housing to start entering the city's supply.

* BUPA - addition of private units on the former petrol station site next to adjacent institution? How many? Any idea when this is proposed to happen? I have assumed that site for potential additions of non-private dwellings in the future but if there are concrete plans for private, self-sustained units, then I will use that in the assumptions instead.

We have had pre-application meetings with BUPA about development on their Fergusson Drive site. They indicated consent would be lodged shortly but nothing has come in yet. The proposed development we saw at pre-app stage was for 52 self-contained apartments but we are in a slightly tricky position forecasting-wise because pre-app meetings are confidential. We have no idea when the consent might come in, or if it would be for something the same or different, or when they might plan to build it. We can let you know when a consent is lodged but I would have thought that although we hope it will happen, including it in forecasting is premature. But we can be guided by your usual practice in respect of speculative development plans. Happy to discuss further.

* CIT - should we assume an increase in non-private dwellings/i.e. long term accommodation numbers there if the plans are for it to be utilised more for long-term stay accommodation? We propose potential for 120 long-stay units at the CIT site, in accordance with the developer's proposal.

In addition to the above:

On the Guildford land (now called the Southern Growth Area) the landowner has now undertaken their own detailed capacity investigations and is still advising yield of 1000 dwellings. This is in the 10-30 year development horizon. They intend to undertake a development that includes clusters of housing as topography allows, and that may include development that is above a standard 'low density' calculation. Our discussions with them about their approach to developing the site gives us confidence that their yield figure is reasonable.

Our estimate for Brentwood in the Land Use Strategy is 86. This was based on a desktop assessment of the possible capacity of the site in accordance with Housing NZ's policies at the time the Strategy was being prepared. However, I do note that HNZ have since shelved some of those initiatives. This probably warrants some re-investigation. At the very least, you should assume that the sites would be developed at standard residential zoning - 400m2 lots. I have some background information about the total amount and location of land if this would be helpful. Maymorn - you have the lower density development estimate in your table twice, is this correct? The Land Use Strategy assumes that only the previous Stages 1-3 of the Maymorn Structure Plan would achieve development at anything approaching residential density. Our estimate is 220 dwellings, in the 10-30 year timeframe. The balance of the land is considered more suitable for responding to demand for lifestyle properties, and would be included in a wider review of rural subdivision standards as part of the District Plan review process. At this stage, a review of the rural standards are scheduled to commence in 2020.

'NZ Army Campus' - can you please confirm the location of this? I'm not sure whether it's something you've uncovered in a data search, or part of the CIT, or something else. You currently have a zero yield shown in the table for it - but we should clear up where exactly we're talking about.

Where are the fruit trees that have had rotting fruit? Perhaps they can be made known so their fruit gets collected. That is the intention behind the fruit trees. There are community groups who are very keen to get hold of fruit. In Pinehaven the PPA has an apple tree and the apples are keenly sought after. It is true that a few apples fall to the ground and need cleaning up. But this is a small price to pay for the bounteous gift.

People won't collect fruit unless they know:

- a) Where the fruit trees are
- b) The fruit is ready for picking
- c) They are allowed to take the fruit

We handle oaks and chestnuts now, so we should be able to handle walnuts, almonds and hazelnuts.

Perhaps we can get some ideas from other nearby Councils how to handle community fruit and nut trees, such as HCC, WCC and PCC? I think some have the idea of a tree guardian – which I guess is what community gardening groups are.

Great to meet with you this morning and breathe fresh air into some ongoing issues around sustainability and resilience in Upper Hutt. It is heartening that you are collectively keen (within budget constraints of course) to achieve good outcomes for Upper Hutt on these fronts.

Some of the issues/ideas that were discussed were:

- Encourage developers and builders to incorporate sustainability practices in new houses including 10,000L rainwater collection, grey water collection, swales, cobblestoned cul-de-sacs and driveways, 15 Amp wiring in garages (to charge electric vehicles), passive solar heating, solar PV panels.
- Provide a discount on consent fees for sustainably built houses (using UHCC's sustainability funding). (Seek further government funding or philanthropic funding for this.)
- Get the Urban Design Protocol and Building Code to include sustainable building guidelines (rainwater collection ,etc as listed above)
- The UHCC Sustainability Strategy will be reviewed after the Land Use Strategy and Open Space strategy are completed, and after the elections are completed so the new council can

decide what they want done.

- For resilience get many more fruit and nut trees in public open spaces. The attached spreadsheet is a starting suggestion of 500 trees to plant in UHCC parks and reserves.
- The iconic Silverstream Spur.

Subject: An update on Policy project timings that may impact on your work

Hi John, Andrea, Andrea, Kerrie, Brett, Kate, Susan & Wendy

We're trying to be more proactive about informing your teams of plan change timeframes, work required & outcomes that potentially have an impact on your respective work areas. I've cc'd CMT as well, so if I've missed anyone, or CMT think someone should know this information as it relates to their work they can forward it on.

So with that intent I'll be doing my best to update you regularly and well in advance. These are the projects and timeframes I think you need to be aware of at the moment. Please let me know if there is anything else you want to know and/or need from the policy team.

- 1. Protected Trees PC 41. Submissions close on the 26th of Feb and further submissions will be called for following that for an additional 10 days. We will get the maps loaded onto our GIS system so you can see what groups effect what properties if required. I am awaiting an update from James about where this at & will let those of you who need them know as soon as I do. We won't be running a hearing for this PC until after the elections. Lead staff member is James Beban
- 2. The Mangaroa PC 15 will be withdrawn subject to council approval tomorrow. If they approve the withdrawal it will be notified on the 2nd of March. We are sending letters to effected landowners next week to give them advanced warning of the change. Lead staff are Brett Osborne (contractor) & Sasha Smith (seconded from MFE)
- 3. Land Use Strategy Upper Hutt 2016 -2046 (was the Upper Hutt Strategy). Subject to Council approval tomorrow this document will be going out for public notification on the 2nd of March for 4 weeks. One of the more notable topics in it, is a proposal to enter into a land swap with the Guildford Timber Company. The intent is to swap Silverstream Spur for 134ha of GTC land behind Pinehaven which would likely be protected as a recreational reserve. It would include a PC for a subdivision of around 1000 lots on the remaining GTC land. This would be done in 18 months' time following due diligence of the land swap. Chris will also be tabling an MOU between GTC & UHCC which describes the intent of the land swap which we are recommending being made publicly available. Brett it would be good to update you in more detail on this one if you'd like it. Lead staff member is Sarah Duffell

- 4. Wallaceville Private Plan Change 40. This PC is currently under appeal. We are awaiting the courts' decision about whether to strike out the appeal and/or award costs if it does go ahead. We are expecting this decision any day. Lead is me
- 5. Natural Hazards PC Mangaroa and Pinehaven PC 42 & 43. These plan changes are eminent. We are planning to notify them in April. We have DP maps ready for Pinehaven and the Mangaroa maps are in their final stages of development. We'll get them into our system asap and again we'll let you know. The Hutt River will be removed from the Mangaroa PC. We'll give you a summary of these plan changes once they have been finalised for easy reference. Key staff are Brett Osborne, James Beban and Sasha Smith

A note that the next PC's to start being developed once capacity frees up are the Significant Natural Areas, Code of Practice and Residential Chapters.
