I note the proposal descriptions in Appendix 1 differ to those provided on the Manatū Taonga website. The Porirua event was the first of a nationwide series of Te Urungi events, and Manatū Taonga has incorporated learnings from subsequent events to improve Innovation Fund processes going forward. A standardised process for describing proposals was developed and implemented after the first round of Te Urungi events. Consequently, there are some differences between earlier proposal descriptions, however both descriptions refer to the same project.

I am advised that Manatū Taonga has apportioned an indicative amount of funding to each Te Urungi event to ensure there are funds available to all participants but, have maintained flexibility in decision making about which projects are awarded funding. Manatū Taonga retains this flexibility so that it can choose to fund innovative projects with the most potential to achieve the Fund outcomes, as those projects emerge.
