

INTRODUCTION:

The stage 1 report approved 1 November 2005 recommended that the area coloured pink be offered back to the former owner or successors and that the area coloured blue be included with the offer back of the area coloured pink, as an additional area. This report identifies the persons to whom an offer back is to be made. An Offer of Sale for signing will be submitted separately once the recommendations of this report have been approved.

LEGAL DESCRIPTION: Lot 2 DP 372602 & Lot 1 DP 12494

**AREA:** 5318m<sup>2</sup>

**ENCUMBRANCES: None** 

**LAND STATUS:** 

The land is comprised in CFR 454454 and CFR 454455 in the name of Her Majesty the Queen for a state primary school. The land is administered by the Ministry of Education by virtue of Section 143(2) Education Act 1989.

#### **MINERAL STATUS:**

The non-statute minerals remain in Crown ownership (affects CFR 454454) and in CT 8A/1061 (affects CFR 454455).

Refer to stage 1 report for full mineral history.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The stage 1 report identifies the former owners as Hepi Te Heuheu, Pateriki Hura, Brian Jones, Wairemana Tamaira, Waratana Ngahana and Iwi Mere Hauauru Tupu, who were acting as trustees for the land owners, confirmed by a Maori Land Court Order dated 3

October 1964. There were some changes to the trustees over time, with the last vesting order for Tauranga Taupo 2B2M3B3B Block dated 17 March 1971 listing the trustees as:

Hepi Hoani Te Heuheu died on 31 July1997 Pateriki Joseph Hura died on 1 November 1980 Brian Jones, resides at St Johns Wood Rest Home & Village, 133 Tamamutu Street, Taupo John te Oranga Hura died on 15 February 1983 Waratana Renata Ngahana died on 2 January 1977

In a letter dated 24 September 2007, Darroch instructed Terry Innis to contact Brian Jones and proceed with a hui of the former owners. A hui was held on 10 November 2007 at Waitetoko Marae, near the subject land. Thirty seven persons attended, with Brian Jones as chairman. It was decided that a working party of four or five people would be set up to consider matters. John Hura became the main contact for the working party.

In his letter of 29 July 2008, Terry Innis advised that there was still a trust in place, but that new trustees could be appointed from those on the working group, to be ratified at a hui and application made to the Maori Land Court. In his email of 23 September 2008, Terry Innis conveyed two proposals from the working group: 1. Land vested in the steering party to hold on behalf of the successors of the original owners; and 2. Vest the land in an existing trust for Tauranga Taupo 2B2M3B3B. This land no longer exists, but the trust was never dissolved. These options were to be investigated through the Maori Land Court.

The working party held a hui on 3 October 2009, in which it was agreed that there is the formation of an Ahu Whenua Trust and the following persons were elected to be the trustees: John Hura, Connie Tamaira, Papuni Hartley, Lance Bell and Te Mare Hahipene.

An application was filed by the trustees at the Maori Land Court to formalise the new trust. A letter from the Maori Land Court dated 4 November 2009, in which they advised John Hura that a section 134 vesting order for the land was required to be processed before the application for the Ahu Whenua Trust could be processed.

In his letter of 25 November 2009, Terry Innis advised that trustees preferred the land to be offered back as General Land.

In an email of 25 March 2010, LINZ requested a stage 2 report, excluding offer back, before any further action is taken so that the matter does not go too far down the wrong path.

A legal opinion was sought from Buddle Findlay, who concluded in their letter of 6 September 2011 that the offer back should be made to Brian Jones, as the sole surviving trustee, on following basis:

- (a) in his capacity as trustee of the Trust (2B2M3B3B Trust);
- (b) Mr Jones acceptance is expressly stated to be on the basis that he accepts it as trustee and acknowledges and agrees with the Crown that he will deal with the land on the basis of and for the purposes of the Trust;
- (c) Before making the offer to Mr Jones in this capacity the Crown receives assurance from the beneficiaries that they do not wish the Crown to make an application under section 134 and that they wish the offer to be made to Mr Jones on the above basis; and
- (d) That there is a mechanism in existence that would immediately hold and deal with the land for the purposes of the Trust, as we are concerned there is now only one trustee and at the difficulties that would arise if he were to pass away while Lot 2 was in his name only. This mechanism might be a mirror trust established for the same purposes, with the same powers and for the same beneficiaries as the Trust.



#### SUMMARY:

The original decision to offer back was made under Section 41(e) Public Works Act 1981. However, this is incorrect, as the land was held by persons acting as trustees for the owners. Under Section 41(c) Public Works Act 1981, the land is not to be vested by the Maori Land Court if the land was held by a trustee or trustees. Therefore, the decision should be amended to offer back pursuant to Section 40(2)(c) Public Works Act 1981.

Furthermore, the offer back should be made to Brian Jones, as the sole surviving trustee for 2B2M3B3B Trust.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that pursuant to Section 40(2)(c) Public Works Act 1981 that the land be offered back to Brian Jones, as the sole surviving trustee for 2B2M3B3B Trust.



#### Hi Tim

Well the hui was an interesting event with 37 people attending. Brian Jones was the chairman for the day. I did the normal spiel about how the land was acquired and how the offer back process worked etc. There were several questions raised from the floor and the most contentious of the lot was the issue of Lot 1 and how the Trust of the day had offered to give the land at no consideration to the school. There were those that suggested that the Crown should be giving that part back.

It took some time to explain subdivision and reserve contributions.

What happened on the day is that a working party has been set up of 4-5 people who will investigate the purchase of the land and take that back to another hui.

I did inform them that the valuation figures in the Section 40 was dated May 2005 and would need to be updated prior to any formal offer being made.

The working party also wish to obtain their own valuation as a comparison and I have suggested that there is no point in doing so until DTZ order a new report.

I would suggest that there will not be much movement until early 2008 as the local marae has hui booked solidly.
