Request for information

Thank you for your request of 14 February 2022, in which you requested the following:

- 1. all communications between the New Zealand Police and any company where the police sought to contract that company to remove the vehicles associated with the "Convoy 2022" protest either in the parliament grounds or within 1km of the parliamentary grounds over the period of 08/02/2022 12/02/22.
- 2. Also, the police stated they could not establish meaningful communication with the "Convoy 2022" protest organisers. I would like to request the documents or communications that were intended for communication with the "Convoy 2022" protest organisers over the period of 08/02/2022 12/02/2022.
- 3. I would like to request all documentation or notices of illegal activity issued to the "Convoy 2022" protest organisers or the "Convoy 2022" protestors during the period of the 08/02/2022 12/02/2022.
- 4. I would like to request any information held by the New Zealand Police that has been referred to by the New Zealand Police as 'misinformation' as it relates to the "Convoy 2022" protest during the period 08/02/2022 12/02/2022.
- 5. I would like to request any communications between the New Zealand Police and any and all representatives of the following companies; Stuff Limited, over the period of 08/02/2022 12/02/2022.

Your request has been considered in accordance with the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA), and I can now provide the following response.

As you may be aware, the Independent Police Conduct Authority (IPCA) has commenced an independent investigation and review (Review) of the policing of the occupation on and around Parliament grounds in Wellington during February and March 2022 (Protest).

Details of the scope of the Review are available on the IPCA's website¹ and you will note this scope includes Police operational execution (including tactics), Police engagement with protestors and other stakeholders, and management of intelligence.

Whilst this Review is underway, information relating to the issues under investigation and review is expected to be the subject of examination by the IPCA under its powers of investigation under

the IPCA Act 1988. With this Review commenced, there is a strong public interest in allowing these matters to be considered in the round by the IPCA.

We consider that the following information requested tends to go to the heart of the matters that are under investigation and review by the IPCA:

- 1. all communications between the New Zealand Police and any company where the police sought to contract that company to remove the vehicles associated with the "Convoy 2022" protest either in the parliament grounds or within 1km of the parliamentary grounds over the period of 08/02/2022 12/02/22.
- 2. Also, the police stated they could not establish meaningful communication with the "Convoy 2022" protest organisers. I would like to request the documents or communications that were intended for communication with the "Convoy 2022" protest organisers over the period of 08/02/2022 12/02/2022.
- 4. I would like to request any information held by the New Zealand Police that has been referred to by the New Zealand Police as 'misinformation' as it relates to the "Convoy 2022" protest during the period 08/02/2022 12/02/2022.

Where such information is available, it is withheld in reliance upon section 9(2)(ba)(ii) of the OIA. It is in the public interest for the Review to be completed without earlier predetermination of the matters it is considering.

We consider the following information requested may be released as indicated:

3. I would like to request all documentation or notices of illegal activity issued to the "Convoy 2022" protest organisers or the "Convoy 2022" protestors during the period of the 08/02/2022 - 12/02/2022.

Please find attached copies of the following documents:

- Standard conditions for the use of Parliament Grounds
- Trespass notice relating to Parliament Buildings dated 10 February 2022.

Please note the personal details of the trespassed person have been redacted pursuant to section 9(2)(a) of the OIA, to protect personal privacy.

People who were arrested and released also received a standard summons or bail notice.

5. I would like to request any communications between the New Zealand Police and any and all representatives of Stuff Limited, over the period of 08/02/2022 - 12/02/2022.

Please refer to Attachment 1 for copies of email correspondence between Police and employees of Stuff Limited, between 8 and 12 February 2022. Some information has been withheld under section 9(2)(a) of the OIA, protect the privacy of natural persons. Police does not consider the public interest in the release of this information outweighs the reasons for withholding it.

The IPCA anticipates the Review will be completed and reported on by 31 March 2023. Police recognises the importance of transparency in these matters and looks forward to the release of the IPCA's report, at which time more detailed information regarding the Police response to the Protest will likely be publicly available.

Please note that as part of its commitment to openness and transparency, Police proactively releases some information and documents that may be of interest to the public. An anonymised version of this response may be publicly released on the New Zealand Police website.

You have the right to ask the Ombudsman to review my decision if you are not satisfied with the response to your request. Information about how to make a complaint is available at: www.ombudsman.parliament.nz.

Reminder from the Speaker as the landlord for Parliament Grounds and Buildings of the policies relating to the standard conditions for the use of Parliament Grounds which include:

- Participants must assemble within and disperse from the grounds in an orderly manner, and so as to not interfere with the flow of vehicular traffic;
- Participants must not mount the main steps nor interfere with the use of Parliament Buildings by those entering or leaving in the normal course of their business
- Sound amplification may be used, however it must always be directed away from the building, and must not be operated in a manner disruptive to occupants of the buildings. The sound equipment should be used for speeches only.

Times that sound equipment can be used:

Non sitting days - 8am to 7pm

Sitting Days: Tuesdays 8am to 2pm - 6pm to 7pm

Wednesdays 1pm to 2pm and 6pm to 7pm Thursdays 1pm to 2pm and 5pm to 7pm

- No erection of tents or any structure is permitted other than hand held signs.
- Please note that Parliament Grounds are alcohol and smoke free

Policies of note:

- Structures including tents as mentioned above are not permitted and if not removed when requested, are liable for confiscation
- Protestors and demonstrators who contact the Office of the Speaker in the course of organising their demonstrations/protests would be reminded that protests and demonstrations are only to take place during daylight hours, and therefore should not continue overnight.

Actions:

- In line with these existing policies, please disassemble any tents or structures and remove them from the grounds.
- Do not continue protests or demonstrations on the grounds after dark





The three men arrested on Parliament grounds earlier today have been charged with obstruction.

The men, aged 61, 57 and 50, have been bailed to appear in the Wellington District Court on Monday 14 February.

All three have also been officially trespassed from Parliament grounds.

At this time, these three men are the only people to be issued with trespass notices from Parliament since the protest activity began on Tuesday.

I understand that Cann quit after a police investigation, Operation Manu, last year revealed he was having an affair with suspected drug dealer 9(2)(a)

s9(2)(a) was arrested when the investigation terminated in late October and was charged with possession of methamphetamine, offering to supply methamphetamine, and conspiring to sell methamphetamine.

I understand that as part of the investigation, Cann's 9(2)(a) property was searched, and he also came under scrutiny by the police's national integrity unit.

It's thought Cann was supplying information to criminals about police activities, such as when searches were going to happen, however it doesn't appear this was ever proved as he was never charged with an offence.



In reference to the above, you requested:

- 1. How many stolen/damaged/abandoned vehicles has the police removed in Hamilton and the Waikato district in 2020, 2021 and 2022 (to date)? I would like this information broken down on a year by year basis.
- 2. What has been the cost of removing stolen/damaged/abandoned vehicles in Hamilton and the Waikato district in 2020, 2021 and 2022 (to date)? I would like this information broken down on a year by year basis.

Your request has been considered in accordance with the Official Information Act 1982. I can advise:

- 1. Vehicles which are stolen and vehicles damaged in crashes are towed with the consent of the registered owner or driver. The registered owner or driver is normally liable for any towing and storage fees as a result. In rare cases, Police may tow without the consent of the registered owner if, for example, it is likely to be re-stolen. Any costs incurred by Police for towing would almost certainly come out of each District's budget.
- 2. Abandoned vehicles are referred to the road controlling authority Waka Kotahi or the respective local council for removal. Police would normally only remove such a vehicle if it posed a hazard to road users.
- 3. There is no central database that records when stolen/damaged/abandoned vehicles are towed by Police, nor is there any operational reason to need such a database that would outweigh the costs involved in maintaining such a database. Individual records of tows would generally be recorded within the details of each occurrence.

We are unable to provide some of the information you have requested pursuant to section 18(f) of the Act as the information requested cannot be made available without substantial collation or research.

If you have any questions, you may contact me.

You have the right to ask the Ombudsman to review my decision if you are not satisfied with Police's response to your request.
