Dear Luke,

Thank you for your email of 12 February 2022 to the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

"a copy of the document signed by Winston Peters in his capacity as foreign affairs minster: "UN Global Migration Compact""

We have interpreted your request to be for "Global Compact For Safe, Orderly And Regular Migration", which was signed by the Rt Hon Winston Peters on 20 December 2018 in his capacity as Minister of Foreign Affairs.

Ordinarily we would have transferred your request under section 14(b)(ii) of the Act, as the information you have requested is more closely connected to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MFAT). Following consultation, MFAT have confirmed your requested document is publicly available and in good faith of the Act we have made the decision to provide this to you directly. As such I am formally refusing your request under section 18(d) of the Act.
