Thank you for your email of 14 August 2014 requesting the following information:

Your request has been considered under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act).

All correspondence between the Ministry and Selwyn College is enclosed and itemised in the attached list.

Deletions have been made under section 9(2)(a) of the Act to protect the privacy of natural persons.

Officials' names below the level of manager have been withheld under section 9(2)(a) of the Act to protect the privacy of natural persons and under 9(2)(f)(iii) of the Act to maintain the constitutional convention protecting the neutrality of officials.

There do not appear to be overriding public interest reasons that support the release of the information withheld.

Under sections 19 and 28(3) of the Official Information Act 1982 you have the right to ask an Ombudsman to review this decision.

Enrolment Scheme -

Further to my discussions with Sheryl Offner, Principal, this is formal notice, siven under Section 11H(1) of the Education Act 1989, that the Ministry of Education considers that there is likely to be overcrowding at your school. Under Section 11H(1) your loard must now begin developing an enrolment scheme.

The purpose of an enrolment scheme, as set out in Section 11A of the Education Act 1989 is:

(a) to avoid overcrowding, or the likelihood of overcrowding at the school; and

(b) to ensure that the selection of applicants for enrolment at the school is carried out in a fair and transparent manner; and

(c) to enable the Secretary to make the best use of existing networks of State schools.

Ministry staff will visit your school within the next month to provide the board with a copy of the Guidelines for the Development and Operation of Enrolment Schemes, and a copy of the binding Instructions issued by the Secretary controlling the operation of enrolment schemes and particularly the holding of ballots. It is important that a member of the board is available for this meeting.

Of particular importance in the development of an enrolment scheme is the designation of a suitable home zone. I strongly recommend that you reach general agreement with the Ministry over the proposed zone prior to undertaking the consultation requirements. Ministry staff will assist with the development of a proposed map which may, of course, be subject to change as a result of the consultation process.

The Selwyn Box met this week to review the proposed zone drawn up by the Ministry. They have asked me to convey to you the following response:

Overall, the BOT is very pleased with the proposal and thoroughly endorses the inclusion of Stonefields as part of Selvyn's home zone.

The BOT does not support the proposal to make St Johns Park a shared zone. The fact that this 'island' it is Glendowie's zone is an historical anomoly. It should be in Selwyn's zone only as it is not 'reasonably convenient' to Glendowie College.

The BOT would prefer the southern zone to be along Marua Road as it is the natural boundary and would certainly want to have Abbots Way and Lunn Ave in the Selwyn zone.

To the west, the BOT would prefer the shared zone to be drawn down Victoria Ave.

The BOT would appreciate knowing the rationale for the wiggly line defining part of the eastern zone in Kohimarama.




ENROLMENT CRITERIA FOR THE TOTARA LEARNING CENTRE

Selwyn College's **Totara Learning Centre** (TLC) provides educational and specialist service support for students with disabilities who have their special needs recognised under the Ongoing Renewable Resourcing Scheme. (ORRs)

Enrolment Criteria:

There are sufficient places in TLC for no more than 15 students.

- 3. Applicants will be aged between 12 % and 19 years.
- 4. Applicants will be expected to be able to participate in some mainstream classes.



Selwyn College REAF Programme is unique nationally and internationally. It is the recipient of a New Zealand Diversity Award, Race Relations. It offers a safe, supportive learning environment that respects adult refugees and their culture. The programme teaches English language and numeracy with emphasis on integration into New Zealand society. The programme equips students with the knowledge, skills and values to be successful citizens.

Background

REAF began its operation in 2000 with the close support of the Ministry of Education. The REAF department has close links to the Carol White Family Centre, built on size by a special MOE granton 2004. This centre receives on-going MOE funding to support the pre-schoolers of refugees so that their parents can attend classes at the school.

Enrolment criteria

The total number of available places in the REAF programme are equivalent to 120 FTTEs or 150 persons who

- Must be adults from refugee communities, quota refugees, as warm seekers, or family reunification.
- Must have residency, PR or citizenship Asylum seekers who have been granted asylum and are awaiting resident status are also able to enrol on production of the correct documentation. Those on a Work Permit may be enrolled but will need to obtain a variation to study.



> The original proposal included an overlap so that parents would have a choice of either a single sex or co-educational school. However there has been considerable feedback from those families that they do not want that option

> The strength of the feedback is such that rather than wait for the end of the consultation period, we are amending the proposed zone now in the interests of the schools and their communities.

> Feedback will continue to be received until August 4 on all other aspects of the proposed enrolment schemes. We will then analyse the feedback and make a decision on the final boundaries of each zone.


