Official Information Act 1982 request

We are replying to your email of 23 August 2014 in which you have requested, under the Official Information Act 1982, the number of permanent name suppression orders from 1 January 2009 to 31 December 2014.

When the suppression provisions of the Criminal Procedure Act 2011 came into force in March 2012, the rules around granting name suppression were tightened.

Consequently, the number of name suppression orders dropped from the year 2012 and this is reflected in the data provided.

Specifically, you have requested the number of permanent name suppression orders:

- a) separated into convicted and discharged persons;
- b) grouped by crime charged with; and
- c) by judge.

In response to your questions 'a' and 'b' above, please find Table 1 and Table 2 attached.

Please note with the attached data:

- It counts number of defendants with permanent name suppression orders;
- An individual is counted once per year for their most serious charge (grouped by ANZSOC codes) by the date of the name suppression direction and by the current court;

Please also note that figures between one and four, have been replaced by "<4", to preserve the privacy of the persons reflected in the data.

In regard to question 'c', the Ministry cannot provide you with this information because it forms part of the court record which can only be accessed with judicial permission. The Ministry can access some information for statistical purposes; however, this level of detail is not available in the datasets that we use to analyse statistical data.

Similarly, the outcome data is available by whether a conviction was entered or not. The dataset used for reporting does not specify whether a person was discharged as opposed to acquitted or whether the charges were all withdrawn.
