



Operational Updates

Operation Whakahokinga Mai

Two New Zesland Defence Force (NZDF) personnel deployed to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade's (MFAT) Operation Whakshokings Mai returned to New Zealand on 13 and 19 March respectively. The two personnel had originally deployed to Pakistan in January to assist Afghan nationals with eligible New Zealand visas to itsuel to New Zealand via Pakistan. This was part of ongoing MFAT-led efforts to assist Afghan nationals following the conclusion of the Non-Combatant Evacuation Operation in August 2021. During the deployment to Pakistan, the NZDF personnel helped to facilitate the departure of deployment to Pakistan nationals for onward travel to New Zealand.

3. Hon Jenny Salesa visited the Combined Maritime Force (CMF) in Bahrain on 31 March. The purpose of the visit was to meet the NZDF personnel who are based there, to understand the CMF mission, and to receive a brief on Operation TIKI was the NZDF command of Task Force 150 and included the seizure of drugs with an estimated New Zealand street value of NZ\$3 billion. Operation TIKI concluded on 18 January 2022.

EXercise SKYTRAIN

4. The Royal New Zealand Air Force (RNZAF) Fixed Wing Transport Force is conducting Exercise SKYTRAIN 22 from 28 March to 8 April using RNZAF Base Ohakea to simulate a forward operating base (FOB). The exercise will involve two C-130 Hercules aircraft working in a simulated LOW-MEDIUM threat environment. Tactical readiness training will be conducted in the form of tactical low-level flying and sirdrop (light equipment, container delivery system and heavy equipment).

As well as crew qualification and currency, the exercise will encompase training for Force Enablers from Army and Air Force supporting Units. 5 Movements Company from Linton will carry out expeditionary operations including deployment /redeployment, and rigging and inspecting of serial delivery systems from an FOB. RNZAF Air Movements personnel will contribute to marshalling, rigging/derigging and securing loads. Controlled Communications contribute to marshalling, rigging/derigging and securing loads. Controlled Communications

Security Measures and controls (COMSEC) will be carried out by Communications and Information Systems personnel to familiarise crews with standard operation procedures in a theatre environment. Additionally, medical scenarios will be carried out including loading/unloading patients and securing procedures to enhance familiarisation with crew and medical staff.

Rim of the Pacific Exercise (RIMPAC) 22

6, Six NZDF personnel are in San Diego, United States (US), from 25 March to 6 April attending the Rim of the Pacific (RIMPAC) Staff Exercise. Included with the group is a Royal New Zealand Mavy Captain who will deploy to RIMPAC in the appointment of Sea Combat Commander. The Staff Exercise is a key RIMPAC milestone activity in the build up to RIMPAC Commander. The Staff Exercise is a key RIMPAC milestone activity in the build up to RIMPAC S2 which will take place in July and August this year and involve in excess of 32,000 participants from 27 countries.

RIMPAC is a biennial multi-national combined exercise, hosted by US Indo-Pacific Command. RIMPAC involves all aspects of maritime based warfate disciplines, tailored to meet the requirements of each participating country, resulting in a diverse and changing programme to achieve individual nation aims and objectives.

8. Exercise design for RIMPAC 22 focuses on the conduct of high-end joint warfighting operations in a predominantly maritime coalition environment, including amphibious operations. RIMPAC 22 Exercise outcomes will be achieved by participating nations deploying a combination of maritime assets and Headquarters augmentees, targeting training and coalition interoperability opportunities. The exercise will be conducted predominantly out of coalition interoperability opportunities. The exercise will be conducted predominantly out of out of San Diego.

Support to Papua New Guinea National Elections 2022

Pollowing a request from Papus New Guinea (PNG) officials for NZDF assistance in relation to national elections to be held from 18 June to 8 July 2022, a two person NZDF assessment feam deployed to Port Moresby over the period 28 March to 1 April. While in PNG, the team integrated with an Australian Defence Force reconnaissance team, conducted engagements and gathered information with the aim of informing further NZDF planning for support to the PNG national elections.





Operation PROTECT - Conclusion

From 25 March 2020, the New Zealand Detence Force (NZDF) has supported the All-of-Government response to the COVID-19 pandemic through Operation PROTECT, making a significant contribution to efforts to keep New Zealand safe. This support has enabled the management of COVID-19 risk to the community posed by the nearly 230,000 people who have entered New Zealand and the Managed Isolation and Quarantine (MIQ) system at the border, along with over 3,600 COVID-19 cases from within the community. Through Operation PROTECT, the NZDF has deployed more than 6,200 personnel to the MIQ system over the past two years (900 to 1200 personnel committed at any given time), with 3,278 soldiers committed from the New Zealand Army alone, including more than 500 Reserve Force personnel.

2, The implementation of the New Zealand Government's Reconnecting New Zealanders to the World plan has reduced the demand for MIQ at the border. On 10 March the Government announced its intent to reduce MIQ facilities commencate with this significant drop in demand. Consequently, the NZDF has drawn down its commitment to Operation and Employment. This transition will see the majority of NZDF Minlatry of Business, Innovation and Employment. This transition will see the majority of NZDF personnel currently posted or seconded to MIQ return to their home units by 2 May and the research of all support to MIQ by 1 June.

Exercise BERSAMA SHIELD 2022 - Update

3. As reported previously, the BERSAMA series of exercises are a continuation of the development of the Headquarters Integrated Area Defence System training requirement to exercise Five Power Defence Arrangement (FPDA) defence forces in the conduct of joint operations in a multi-threat environment for the defence of Malaysis and Singapore. Exercise PERSAMA SHIELD 2022 involved nine NZDF personnel and concluded on 1 April.

A The exercise has been judged a success by the NZDF contingent, with both FPDA and NZDF exercise objectives being schieved and the sequence of programmed exercise scenario events being fully executed. The primary intent was to exercise all elements of the command and control infrastructure with a focus on providing the force elements involved with individuallevel training skills and experience.

Provision of Assistance to Ukraine - Update

5. Recent NZDF assistance to the defence of Ukraine has included a range of stores including body amour, helmets and vests; the deployment of intelligence analysts to the United Kingdom (UK); and the deployment of two people to the UK and Belgium to enhance engagement with, and understanding of, partner activities related to the Ukraine.

6. Two of the intelligence analysts arrived in London earlier this month and are undergoing orientation and induction while security clearance processes are worked through. Four more departed New Zealand on 5 April and are being inducted by the New Zealand Defence staff in London for two days, before being employed at s. 6(a)

Support to East Coast Floods

8. The NZDF provided support to the Tairawhiti Region after the Tairawhiti Civil Defence and Emergency Management Group (CDEM) declared a State of Local Emergency in response to extensive flooding and resultant damage throughout the tegion. An NZDF Reconnaissance Team conducted comprehensive needs / response assessments throughout the Tairawhiti CDEM region from 28 March to 1 April. The assessments supported CDEM in allocating resources to tasks and concluded, in many instances, that no further NZDF allocating resources to tasks and concluded, in many instances, that no further NZDF involvement over that already provided was appropriate in the recovery phase.

9. In addition to the assessments, a number of tasks were supported by the NZDF. These included logistics support through the vehicle delivery of food and medical aid in conjunction with commercial transport operators and rotary wing planning support to the Wairoa District. The additional transportation of a generator and tuel tank to a remote area was subsequently cancelled by the Wairoa District Council as road access was restored. The NZDF also provided clean-up and recovery oversight through the coordination of the civilian work force over the period 2 to 3 April.

HMNZS Manawanui survey of RMS Niagara

10. HMNZS Manawanui undertook a Remotely Operated Vehicle (ROV) survey of the wreck of the Royal Mail Ship (RMS) MINGARA, east of the Hen and Chickens Islands as part of an offshore ROV training course being conducted over the period 4 to 15 April. Manawanui is the Royal New Zealand Mavy's specialist dive, salvage and hydrographic vessel. The ship entered service in 2019. Following a maintenance and modification period, sea trials began in March this year ahead of final Operational Release.

11. Niagara was a transpacific steam ocean liner, Royal Mail Ship and refrigerated cargo ship. The ship sunk in 1940 after striking a mine off the coast of New Zealand and sunk near the Hen and Chicken islands. A storyboard of the Manawanui ROV survey of the Niagara is attached to this report.







Operational Updates

Operation TIEKE - NZDF Support to Ukraine

Operation TIEKE is the New Zealand Defence Force (NZDF) support to international efforts in the self-defence of Ukraine. As noted last week, the first phase of Operation TIEKE was completed with the delivery of a range of stores to the Coalition Logistics Enabling Node in Rzeszow, Poland, the deployment of Intelligence Analysts to the United Kingdom (UK) and the deployment of a lisison officer to the Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers Europe in Belgium, to be the New Zealand Assistant Deputy Permanent Milliary Representative to supplement existing staff. The deployment of a staff officer to the Permanent Joint Headquarters in the UK has been delayed subject to the confirmation of coordinating arrangements.

The second phase of deployments is currently underway based on the Cabinet decision of 11 April. An advance party of three staff has been deployed to liaise with New Zealand Defence Staff London, to reconnoitre key nodes and to form the core of the Logistics Task Group in the International Donor Coordination Command Headquarters to coordinate has been established at the United States European Command Headquarters to coordinate the reception and transportation of sid from global donors and to facilitate the onward movement to Ukraine. 



Operational Updates

Operation PROTECT - Update

The majority of New Zealand Defence Force (NZDF) personnel have now returned from Operation PROTECT. A total of 21 personnel remain involved during the final draw-down phase. Specifically, 11 personnel are supporting the final transition of Managed Isolation and Quarantine leadership to Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) staff until 13 May, eight personnel are facilitating the wind-up of the Joint Task Force Headquarters until 13 May, and two NZDF planners remained seconded to assist with MBIE's future contingency planning until 31 May.

Operational Updates

Update on NZDF Support to Ukraine (Operation TIEKE)

Hew Zealand Defence Force (NZDF) Force Elements continue to operate in a dynamic environment across Europe in support of Ukraine's self-defence. All functional components (Air Task Group, Logistics Task Group, Embedded Staff Officers and Analysts) are well established and operating with their supported agencies (United Kingdom (UK) and NATO). The Air Task Group will transition to its fourth mission set following a maintenance period this week. For the short to medium term there is no sign that tasking for the C-130H will slow, although there is some change in emphasis from donations of aid, to an increasing although there is some change in emphasis from donations of the training element for personnel movements; primarily to support a ramping up of the training operating Logistic Modes. Frigate Systems Upgrade

In 2021 legal action was brought against Lockheed Martin Canada (LMC), the prime contractor for the Frigate Systems Upgrade project, by Victoria Shipyards Limited (VSL) – LMC's installation subcontractor on the project. These legal proceedings have not impacted on the delivery of HMNZS Te Kaha or Te Mana.

4. On 12 May, the Supreme Court of British Colombia ordered an amended case plan to account for delays in reviewing hundreds of thousands of documents relating to the proceedings. This was reported over the past weekend by a number of Canadian media outlets.

5. The Canadian Department of Justice is determining which of these documents need to be treated as 'highly sensitive and protected information'. It is being assisted by the Canadian Department of National Defense Release and Disclosure Coordination Office (DND).

(1) ISRAEL: EXERCISE AGAINST IRAN

(u) The Israell AirForce (IAF) will reportedly simulate a wide scale strike against Iran later this month, during its joint military exercise named Chairobs of Fire. In addition to finding ways to strike Iranian nuclear facilities that are buried deep underground, requiring specialised munitions and bactics, the IAF will have to deal with increasingly sophisticated Iranian air defences. The upcoming drill is also expected to focus on preparing for and responding to retailation by Iran and its allies.

2) LEBANON: HEZBOLLAH LOSES MAJORITY

(u) The Lebanese Hezboliah-led (LH) bloc consisting of the Free Patriotic Movement (FPM) and the Shia Amal movement has lost its majority in parliament, securing 62 out of 128 seats following elections on 15. May. LH and Amal's candidates retained the 27 seats allocated to Shia Muslims, but the Christian FPM party lost support. The Lebanese Forces is now the largest Christian party in parliament, winning an additional four seats. Although an upset for LH's bloc, the chance of significant change is reportedly low due to the rigid power-sharing political structure.

3) TURKEY: THREAT TO BLOCK NATO ASPIRANTS

(U) Finland and Sweden have expressed their desire to join the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (NATO) and have secured domestic political support to apply for membership formally. Aspirant NATO countries must secure universal agreement from current members of the Alliance. Turkey, however, has threatened to block their bid, citing concerns over their stitlude towards terrorist organisations' (referring to the Kurdistan Workers' Party) and the fact that both countries have imposed arms embargos on Ankara since 2019.

4) UKRAINE: MARIUPOL SURRENDER

(u) On Monday 16 May, Ukrainian fighters gave up their defence of the Azovskil steel plaint in Mariupol after a lengthy resistance. Ukrainian officials said they were seeking to conduct a prisoner swap with Russia to secure their release. Ukrainian President Volodymr Zelenskiyy cautioned that the 'work of bringing the boys home continues, and this work needs delicacy – and time.' Two Russian officials have made negative statements about conducting a swap. One politician labelled the prisoners animals in human form' while another stated

(ii) Minister for Defence Dr.Ng cig Hen made an official visit to Estonia and Latvia from 12 to 17 May. He said the crip had been useful from the perspective of Letting up the Singapore Armed Forces' Digital and intelligence Service, which will be responsible for intelligence; cyber and psychological defence. 6 CHINA: AMPHIBIOUS SHIP GROUP (

(u) I wo People's Liberation Army Navy, I ype 075 amphibious assault ships, the Guangxi and Hainan, have sailed together for the first time. The vessels were shown in a promotional video released to commemorate the Guangxi's April commissioning. The Global Times said the two-ship group was a new instrument for amphibious landing missions. A third Type 075 ship is reportedly undergoing sea trials.

(U) President Rodrigo Duterte has a signed a new law that sets a fixed three-year term for the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) chief of staff, vice chief of staff, deputy chief of staff, service chiefs, heads of unified commands and inspector general. One of the law's aims is to obviate revolving door accommodation promotions, according to the Philippine News Agency. A spotespierson said the 'AFP is confident that the newly-signed law will bring stability in the military organisation':

(8) PNG: ELECTION SECURITY RISKS

(u) An academic from the University of Papua New Guinea (PNG), said resource-constrained police and the correctional service, mass availability of lilegal firearms, and the politicisation of the security forces will present major issues during the election. Additionally both the police and the correctional services are operating without adequate funding, and low, Covid-19 vaccination rates are a concern—about three percent of the eligible population are vaccinated. There is a need for ongoing efforts to improve security in PNG, not just for election security operations; but beyond the election cycle."

9 PNG: NEW LANDING CRAFT

(U) On 13 May, the PNG Defence Force (PNGDF) received a new landing craft—NUSHIP Cape Gloucester—from the Australian Defence Force (ADF). PNGDF Commander Major-General Mark. Goina said they had three ships currently patrolling the PNG waters and the landing craft would be used to carry cargo. On 11 May, Guardian Class Patrol Boat HMPNGS Francis Guardian Class Patrol Boat HMPNGS Francis Agwi was commissioned in Wewak. The vessel had been gifted to the PNGDF by the ADF in 2021.

10 KIRIBATI: RESILIENCE BOOST

(U)The World Bank has approved US\$20 million for a climate change adaptation project for Kiribati. The project will assist up to 14,000 people in the remote outer Islands of Kiribati with improvements to fresh water and drainage, coastal protection, upgrades to critical facilities and equipment maintenance. The project will build on existing World Bank efforts in Kiribati for climate adaptation and disaster resilience.

11) VANUATU: MINISTRY OF JUSTICE

(u) During the opening of the 2022 First Ordinary Session of Parliament, the Vanuatu President, Pastor Obed Moses Tallis, called on the Vanuatu Government not to abolish the Ministry of Justice as it could lead to a dictatorial state. In 2020, the Vanuatu Government amounced that the Ministry of Justice and Community Services would be replaced by a new Ministry of Fisheries, Oceans and Maritime affairs in order to focus on increasing economic production of their resource rich maritime environment.

(12) FUI: FRENCH NAVY VISIT

(u) French Navy, ship F/34 Vendemiaire, with 95 personnel on board, left Fiji on Friday after a three-day port call. The ship surveys wide areas to help prevent human trafficking, drug trafficking and illegal fishing. Operations officer Lieutenant Cyrille highlighted they can have the Fijian authorities on board when they sail in the Fiji Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ). He clarified that France does not have any legal powers inside Fiji's EEZ, and if they see any fishing vessels; they report them to the Fijian Navy.

3) TONGA: NEW POLICE COMMISSIONER

(u) Tonga has announced the appointment of a new Police Commissioner, Shane McLennan from Australia, for a three year term. McLennan takes up the position from former commissioner, New Zealander Stephen Caldwell, who retired in 2021. The position was filled in the Interim by His Majesty's Armed Forces Chief of Defence Staff Brigadier Lord Fielakepa. MatLennan is expected to be sworn in once he has finished his seven day


