## Your Official Information Act request, reference: HNZ00007450

Thank you for your email on 23 November 2022 asking for information which has been considered under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act).

As you may be aware a new government agency, Health New Zealand (Health NZ), was established on 1 July 2022 pursuant to the Pae Ora (Healthy Futures) Act 2022 (the Act). As such, the functions previously under the former District Health Boards have transferred to Te Whatu Ora Health New Zealand. As the matters you have raised now fall under the functions of Te Whatu Ora, our agency will respond to your request.

## You asked:

"So from what I understand, the vaccine was pushed based on incomplete trials by Pfizer, the MoH took their word for it, Pfizer tried to hide their trial data for 75 years, the efficacy and safety was not tested for and the mouthpieces that pushed it were simply unaware? Who were the ad agencies and who were the ministers and officials that oversaw this process?

Could I please have a list of medical professionals / medical bodies consulted by the government as well as the ministers that reviewed the Pfizer safety data before stating it was 'safe and effective' especially for pregnant people."

Medsafe is the New Zealand Medicines and Medical Devices Safety Authority. Medsafe evaluates applications for all new medicines, including COVID-19 vaccines, to ensure that they comply with international standards and local requirements for quality, safety and efficacy. Only if the medicine meets these standards will Medsafe approve a medicine for use in New Zealand.
