Dear Brendan

I refer to your Official Information Act 1982 (OIA) request to Police of 29 July 2022, in which you ask for:

"Please supply all information pertaining to the decision making process regarding the release of the of the two linked documents in particular the differences in decision making for the sections which are redacted in one release but not the other. This could be (but is not limited to) emails, memos, or information known by the police but not yet written down.

I am trying to understand why the release of the redacted sections might prejudice the maintenance of the law in one case, but not in another.

If the two documents are different versions (which I cannot tell from my end) please also provide comment as far as practicably allowed as to the extent of change to the redacted sections. For example please let me know if they are substantially the same, or contain major revisions.

If it helps you in processing my request - I reside in New Zealand.

The first OIA you refer to (reference: IR-01-20-2028) is a Police response to a request for information about 'the procedure to investigate a burglary when the suspect is known'.

Redactions to that response were made in relation to information that was either not relevant to the request, or was refused pursuant to section 6(c) OIA.

The second OIA (reference: IR-01-18-11600) was a specific request for information around individuals, photographing and filming in public, and peeping and peering into a dwelling house.

The two documents are different versions of the same policy. Police Manual Chapters are regularly updated.

I enclose the two relevant Police OIA Request Cover Sheets, which contain information about the approval process applied in each case.

The two OIA releases were made by different members of Police, from different groups within Police, over a year apart.
