MATTERS ARISING.	Miss Halford suggested that the Board formulate a procedure to

MATTERS ARISING:

Miss Halford suggested that the Board formulate a procedure to address matters arising from correspondence that needed to be actioned between Board meetings. This to be discussed at the next monthly Board Meeting.

It was agreed that the 3-00-pm deadline for correspondence the day before each Board Meeting should be upheld to provide time for processing.

Dr Casey requested that the correspondence relating to the election of a Student Trustee be read out. The Chairman ruled that the correspondence had been available to the Board Members to read beforehand as agreed and there was therefore no need for it to be read out.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT: The Principal's report was taken as read. Miss Halford added that:

- the Health Committee had met with the Teacher Support Service that day.
- the Intercollegiate Swimming Sports were to be held on Tuesday 22 February and commented on the high level of participation and enjoyment by all at the Kuranui Swimming Sports

- Prefects and Tutor Group Leaders had been announced at a special assembly on Friday 11 followed by morning tea with those students appointed, parents and staff. It is intended that the "buddy system" presently in operation at Level 1 be extended to involve Level 2 classes also.
- the Te Whiti camp for senior students will not now be held as too many of these students are involved with other camps being held at the same time. Leadership activities are to be held at College at a later time.
- Following the TQM training undertaken by a number of staff last year a Chief Facilitator and Steering Committee have been appointed and have identified two initial areas to be addressed.
- Community Education is now under way with a number of courses still having 2/3 vacancies available. Advertisements are currently running in the Wairarapa News.

MOTION: THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE PRINCIPAL'S REPORT. HALFORD/TE KANI

Dr Casey mentioned that Blair Adams had been chosen for the National Swimming Championships.

It was agreed that the Board should send letters of congratulations to the winners of the Kuranui College Swimming Sports.

CO-OPTION OF MAORI REPRESENTATIVE:

The Chairman advised that following the briefing session with the Principal and himself, Mrs Win Morris had accepted the Board's invitation to become the Maori Trustee on the Board.

MOTION: THAT MRS WIN MORRIS BE CO-OPTED ONTO THE KURANUI COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

The Chairman advised that the term for this co-option would be until the next Board Elections in April 1995.

PROPERTY REPORT:

Mrs Sutherland presented the Property Report as tabled and added that approval had been received for the exterior painting of the Transition Block to start on the following Tuesday.

STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE:

The Chairman advised that this issue would be addressed strictly according to Standing Orders. He then explained the timing and order of speakers in terms of those Orders to address the following motion:

MOTION: That no Student Trustee be elected to the Board of Kuranui College in 1994 but two prefects to be asked to attend Board Meetings and act as liaison between the Board and the student body.

SUTHERLAND\CALVERT

Dr Casey wished to move a motion to give the public speaking rights. The Chairman advised that he would not accept such a motion as the decision had to be made by the Board and the issue had been well discussed and aired prior to the Board Meeting. After heated discussion Dr Casey advised that if the Chairman did not grant the public speaking rights she would move a "Vote of No Confidence" against the Chairman. The Chairman again declined to allow the public speaking rights and advised Dr Casey that she could not move the Motion of No Confidence as there was a motion on the table for Dr Casey refused to accept this advice without clarification and moved a "Vote of No Confidence" against the Chairman which was seconded by Mrs James.

ADJOURNMENT 8.30 PM:

It was agreed that the meeting should be adjourned for 10 minutes to seek clarification on the issue.

RECONVENED 8.40 PM: The meeting was reconvened and the Chairman advised that no reference clarifying the moving of a Vote of No Confidence when another motion was on the table, had been found. He proposed a compromise where one member of the public could speak for 5 minutes in favour of an Elected Student Representative and one person against, with the meeting adjourning for 5 minutes in order for the public to get organised. At this point Dr Casey was not willing to retract her Motion of No Confidence. After some discussion the following motion was put to the vote:

> **MOTION:** THAT 2 MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC BE GIVEN 5 MINUTES EACH TO SPEAK - 1 FOR THE CONTINUANCE OF AN ELECTED STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE AND 1 AGAINST: ALSO 2 STUDENTS BE GIVEN 3 MINUTES EACH TO SPEAK -1 FOR AND ONE AGAINST.

ADJOURNMENT 8.50 PM\RECONVENED 8.55 PM:

Mrs Prince asked Dr Casey if in the interest of the meeting progressing and the dignity of the Chair, she would withdraw her Motion of No Confidence. Dr Casey agreed.

On the toss of a coin it was decided that the speaker for the continuance of an Elected Student Representative should address the meeting first. Mr Mike Lloyd addressed the meeting in this capacity followed by Mr Denis Fenwick who spoke on behalf of those against. Miss Georgia Bleakley addressed the meeting on behalf of the students, speaking in favour of a Student Representative. There was no student speaker against.

The Chairman then invited Mrs Sutherland to speak to her motion. Mrs James suggested an amendment to the motion but the Chairman ruled that as this amendment essentially changed the intent of the original motion it was not acceptable. Mrs Sutherland addressed the meeting. Following her address the Chairman invited each of the other Board Members to speak to the motion - they spoke in the following order: Mrs Prince, Dr Casey - who also presented a petition signed by 101 people in favour of the continuance of an Elected Student Representative, Ms Beyer, Mr Theobald, Mrs James, Mr Te Kani, Mr Calvert, Mrs Morris and Miss Halford. The Chairman then gave Mrs Sutherland the right to reply, which she did.

Clarification was sought by Board members on a number of details relating to the functioning of the Student Representatives as proposed by the motion and the Chairman asked the Board Members to vote via a show of hands.

5 votes were recorded in favour of the motion; 5 votes against. The Chairman therefore made a Casting Vote in favour of the motion.

CARRIED

Dr Casey objected to the Chairman using the Casting Vote to change the status quo and requested that clarification be sought from the NZSTA and/or the MOE as to whether or not this was acceptable.

The majority of the public present left the meeting at this time.
