Thank you for your email of 19 September 2014 requesting, under the Official Information Act (OIA) 1982, an audio recording of your Disputes Tribunal hearing.

First, I must advise that the OIA does not extend to the judicial functions of a tribunal. Conducting a hearing is a judicial function of the Disputes Tribunal and your request falls outside the OIA.

Access to an audio recording of a Disputes Tribunal hearing is governed by the Disputes Tribunals Rules 1989. Under the Rules, the record kept by a Referee is not searchable or accessible. This includes an audio recording of the hearing, and there is no provision for parties to obtain a copy of the recording or a transcript.

The exception to this is where a party to a case has lodged an appeal to the District Court against a decision of the Disputes Tribunal. In such cases a party can apply to the District Court for a transcript, and it would be a decision for a District Court Judge as to whether a transcript is ordered to be produced.

You have the right, by way of complaint to an Ombudsman under section 28(3) of the OIA, to seek an investigation and review of this response.
