New Zealand's constitutional arrangements

Thank you for your email of 31 August 2022, in which you asked if New Zealand has a written constitution. Your request has been referred to me for a response, as it falls within my responsibilities as General Manager, Civil and Constitutional Policy.

New Zealand does not have a single written constitution. Instead, our constitutional arrangements are contained in various laws, documents and conventions. The laws include Acts of Parliament such as:

- the New Zealand Bill of Rights Act 1990 (which sets out core fundamental rights and freedoms);
- the Constitution Act 1986 (which sets out our fundamental constitutional framework, such as the powers of the executive, legislative and judicial branches of government);
- the Electoral Act 1993 (which sets out the rules that govern how our electoral system operates); and
- the Human Rights Act 1993 (which seeks to promote freedom from discrimination and fair and equitable treatment of all people).

Other documents relating to constitutional matters include:

- the Treaty of Waitangi (which established a constitutional relationship between Māori and the Crown);
- documents issued under the authority of the Queen of New Zealand in her capacity as our head of state (such as the Letters Patent 1983 constituting the Office of Governor-General of New Zealand); and
- the Cabinet Manual (which outlines some of our constitutional conventions and practices).
