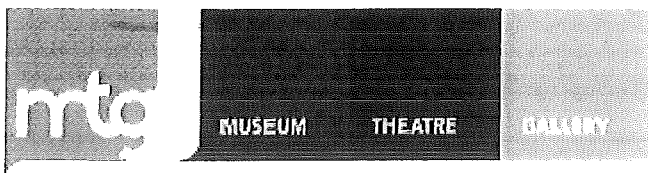
There is no connection to the contemporary Labour party.
