 section 6(a), as the release of this material would likely prejudice the security and defence of New Zealand, or the international relations of the Government of New Zealand

- section 6(b)(i), as the release of this information would likely prejudice the entrusting of information to the Government of New Zealand on a basis of confidence by another government
- section 9(2)(b)(ii), would likely unreasonably to prejudices the commercial position of the person who supplied or who is the subject of the information
- section 9(2)(g)(i), to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through the free and frank expression of opinions

Where information has been withheld under section 9(2), it is not considered that the public interest in this information outweighs the need to protect it.

Under section 28(3) of the Act, you have the right to request an Ombudsman to investigate and review this response.
