

Good Morning Jared

^{9(2)(g)(ii)} informed me yesterday that she has finally communicated to you MOHs decision not to sign the MO**V** between DIA and the Ministry as well as not to progress with the triage system/dashboard.

Firstly, despite this decision, I want to extend my sincere thanks to you and the Digital Safety team for the work they did on this. I am aware that individuals like 9(2)(9)(ii) and others put a lot of work in and apparently for no result which may be disappointing for them.

However, it might be worth giving some context to why this happened to aid understanding and show that while this has not gone forward DART still found it extremely useful and we remain appreciative of the help DIA did provide.

Firstly, MOH has scaled back DART functions to internal (MOH) and Comms only which means that the Clearinghouse (for all of government) concept was no longer considered part of DARTs work. This also affected the arrangement DART had with CERT regarding collecting public reports of disinformation and in that sense with no further reports coming in and the internal focus, a decision was made to not sign the MOU and to not utilise the dashboard as without access to its backend and MOH not willing to have it in its system this left DIA carrying the can indefinitely.

This was not the outcome I was hoping for and I was unhappy with the extensive time taken for MOH to make this decision but the final decision was made at the DG level after it had progressed up through the other levels. Sadly this means DART failed on the final hurdle and leaves DART in a precarious position in some ways as we remain the only function in government looking at disinformation on a day-to-day basis and the demand for us to help and work with others (both inside Health and outside) has not decreased in the last year but increased.

Regardless, I would also like to extend my apologies for the delays (and in the end having wasted DIAs time) on this process. It was my hope that this would have been a simple formality and nothing more but somehow that was not the case and I take responsibility for that and simply want to say it was not what I intended.

None the less, as stated above, this is not a reflection on the great work Digital Safety has done, we remain highly appreciative and hope that DART and DS can work together in future should circumstances require it.

Cessation of support for the DIA-MOH DART Triage System and Dashboard

On 3 December 2021, Te Tari Taiwhenua Department of Internal Affairs (the Department) set out its scope of support for the Ministry of Health (MOH) and Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet (DPMC) regarding the provision of support to MOH to set-up a web-based triage tool for public mis and disinformation reports related to COVID19.

On 28 March 2022 I wrote to you advising that the Department had successfully delivered this fully operational and functioning tool to MOH within the Memorandum of Agreement (the Agreement). While I understand this Agreement remains unsigned on MOH's part, it set out the extent of the Department's support for the DART Triage Systema and Dashboard. This included funding and administratively maintaining the DART Triage System and Dashboard until 30 June 2022.

While we held an expectation that MOH would agree to the Agreement and take carriage of the DART Triage Systems and Dashboard before 30 June 2022; we have not received any communications from you for some time in this regard. Nor have we seen the DART Triage System and Dashboard being used by MOH.

As such, our ability to support and fund the DART Triage System and Dashboard will shortly cease. Should you wish to retain any data from the system I ask that you let me know, in writing, by close of business on 10 September 2022.

It has been our pleasure to support MOH during this project.
