5 mins	<p>E5 – Bona fide</p> <p>E5 is about the instructions relating to assessing a person against the ‘bona fide’ requirements. Ask: <i>What are the characteristics of a bona fide applicant? (Induction week one online module)</i> A bona fide applicant for temporary entry is a person who:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • genuinely intends a temporary stay in New Zealand for a lawful purpose; and • in the opinion of an immigration officer is not likely: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • to remain in New Zealand unlawfully; or • to breach the conditions of any visa granted; or • to be unable to leave or be deported from New Zealand (see E5.10). <p>Ask: <i>In AEWV, stage 1 the employer is accredited, stage 2 the job check is approved and now here in stage 3 work visa, what does a bona fide applicant look like in this context?</i></p> <p>Answer:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The applicant has a lawful purpose, i.e. a work opportunity in New Zealand. • Now think of it another way, if the applicant had previously been to New Zealand and breached their visa conditions, they may not be a bona fide applicant. It would certainly be a concern for INZ, worth looking into further. <p>What does this mean for my role?</p> <p>You many need to assess if an applicant is bona fide. It is likely you will be able to accept an applicant is bona fide at face value, unless there is a warning against the applicant or a risk rule has triggered.</p>

- If the person has been accepted into another country, this may support their claim of being a bona fide applicant eg The UK have granted this person a study visa, this may help reduce some of our concerns about their bona fide status.

The immigration officer checks AMS and sees that the records made offshore include a supportive letter from his employer and that this was a factor in the bona fides assessment. The immigration officer then rings [redacted] to ask him some questions.



What if you decide it is not a 'bona fide applicant'?

If you're not satisfied that an applicant is bona fide and consider that an exception to instructions is not appropriate, you must decline the application or manage risks by other means, such as offering to grant a limited visa or imposing a bond.

The applicant should be informed of the reasons for the decline clearly in the decline letter, including being given a clear explanation of how the information that led to the decision relates to the applicant not meeting the definition of a 'bona fide applicant'.

Recording a decision

Any information, either positive or negative, used to determine whether a person meets bona fide criteria should be recorded as part of the decision making process.

The record should clearly explain:

- the assessment undertaken
- the factors considered, and
- the link between the factors and definition of a bona fide applicant.

- A bona fide applicant for temporary entry is a person who genuinely intends to stay in New Zealand temporarily for lawful purposes.
- Assessment of bona fides is a vital part of assessing temporary entry applications.
- Assessment must be based on the criteria described in instructions.
- You should use the same terms in your communications as is in instructions.
- Records about decisions should include assessment undertaken, factors considered, and how they link to the definition of a bona fide applicant.
