Resource Consent

Pursuant to the Resource Management Act 1991, the Northland Regional Council (hereinafter called "the Council") does hereby grant a Resource Consent to:

FAR NORTH HOLDINGS LIMITED, PO BOX 7 OPUA, 0241

To carry out the following activities in the coastal marine area at Paihia at or about location co-ordinates 1699390E 6095293N:

Note: All location co-ordinates in this document refer to Geodetic Datum 2000, New Zealand Transverse Mercator Projection.

AUT.005454.44.02 To alter and extend the Paihia Wharf facilities authorised by AUT.005454.12.01 and AUT.005454.43.01.

AUT.005454.45.02 To place use and occupy space with new fender piles and dolphin piles (including headstocks).

AUT.005454.46.01 To occupy part of the coastal marine area with part of a building and a deck area to the exclusion of others.

Subject to the following conditions:

GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLYING TO ALL CONSENTS

- The Consent Holder shall, for the purposes of adequately monitoring these consents as required under Section 35 of the Act, on becoming aware of any contaminant associated with the Consent Holder's operations escaping otherwise than in conformity with these consents:
 - (a) Immediately take such action, or execute such work as may be necessary, to stop and/or contain such escape; and
 - (b) Immediately notify the Council by telephone of an escape of contaminant; and
 - (c) Take all reasonable steps to remedy or mitigate any adverse effects on the environment resulting from the escape; and
 - (d) Report to the Council's Monitoring Manager in writing within one week on the cause of the escape of the contaminant and the steps taken or being taken to effectively control or prevent such escape.

In regard to telephone notification, during Council opening hours the Council's assigned monitoring officer for these consents shall be contacted. If that person cannot be spoken to directly, or it is outside of Council opening hours, then the Environmental Hotline shall be contacted.

Advice Note: The Environmental Hotline is a 24 hour, 7 day a week, service that is free to call on 0800 504 639.

The Council may, in accordance with Section 128 of the Resource Management Act 1991, serve notice on the Consent Holder of its intention to review the conditions of this consent annually during the month of May to deal with any adverse effects on the environment that may arise from the exercise of the consent and which it is appropriate to deal with at a later stage. The Consent Holder shall meet all reasonable costs of any such review.

Advice Note: The Council may, in accordance with Section 128 of the Resource Management Act 1991, serve notice on the Consent Holder of its intention to review the conditions any time for the following purposes:

- (a) To provide for compliance with rules relating to, minimum standards of water quality in any regional plan that has been made operative since the commencement of the consent; or
- (b) To provide for compliance with any relevant national environmental standards that have been made; or
- (c) Where there are inaccuracies in the information made available with the application that materially influenced the decision on the application and where the effects of the exercise of consent are such that it is necessary to apply more appropriate conditions.
- Prior to the expiry, cancellation, or lapsing of these consents, the Consent Holder shall remove the structures and other materials and refuse associated with these consents from the consent area and shall restore the consent area to the satisfaction of the Council, unless an application for replacement consents has been properly made beforehand.

CONDITIONS SPECIFIC TO AUT.005454.44.02 and AUT.005454.45.02 — ALTERATION AND EXTENSION AND PILES

- Installation of new piles and alteration and extension of the Paihia Wharf Facilities authorised by these consents shall be undertaken generally in accordance with the attached Far North Holdings Limited Plans:
 - (a) Job Title: Paihia Wharf and Ferry Building Deck Extension, Drawing Title: Overall Proposed Plan, Project No. 1501, Rev. 3, Sheet No. 102, Dated 31/08/2015. (Also referenced as Northland Regional Council Plan No. 4640/1); and
 - (b) Job Title: Paihia Wharf and Ferry Building Deck Extension, Drawing Title: Proposed Plan, Project No. 1501, Rev. 3, Sheet No. 103, dated 31/08/2015. (Also referenced as Northland Regional Council Plan No. 4640/2); and

- (c) Job Title: Paihia Wharf and Ferry Building Deck Extension, Drawing Title: Proposed Roof Plan, Project No. 1501, Rev. 3, Sheet No. 104, Dated 31/08/2015 (Marked up to show exclusive occupation area) (Also referenced as Northland Regional Council Plan No. 4640/3A); and
- (d) Job Title: Paihia Wharf and Ferry Building Deck Extension, Drawing Title: Proposed Elevations, Project No. 1501, Rev. 0, Sheet No. 202, Dated 16/07/15. (Also referenced as Northland Regional Council Plan No. 4640/4); and
- (e) Job Title: Paihia Wharf and Ferry Building Deck Extension, Drawing Title: Proposed Elevations, Project No. 1501, Rev. 0, Sheet No. 203, Dated 16/07/15. (Also referenced as Northland Regional Council Plan No. 4640/5).
- Prior to construction of the alterations and extension to the Paihia Wharf facilities commencing, the Consent Holder shall lodge a Biosecurity Management Plan (BMP) with the Council's Biosecurity Manager. The BMP shall address measures to avoid the introduction of any unwanted or risk species through the use of construction plant and equipment which is to be bought to the site from other locations. The BMP shall include detailed procedures regarding the cleaning and inspection of machinery and plant brought into the Bay of Islands and details of staff training, monitoring and reporting mechanisms.

The BMP shall have the following objectives:

- (a) To avoid the introduction of any unwanted or risk species into the Bay of Islands in the construction phase of the development;
- (b) To ensure effective treatment of all construction plant and equipment used in association with the construction phase of the development to ensure it does not become a vector for the spread of any unwanted or risk species; and
- (c) To set out a staff biodiversity monitoring and reporting system.
- Prior to the first use of any introduced construction plant and equipment as referred to in Condition 5, the Consent Holder shall arrange inspection of the same for infestation of any unwanted or risk species identified in any National Pest Management Plan or Regional Pest Management Plan for Northland and certification of it having been treated and inspected as required by this condition by a suitably qualified and experienced person. A copy of this certification shall be provided to the Council on request. The Consent Holder shall not allow any construction plant and equipment under its control or direction associated with the proposal to be used that is not certified as having been treated and inspected as required by this condition.
- 7 The Consent Holder shall notify the Council's Monitoring Manager in writing of the date construction activity on site is intended to commence, at least two weeks beforehand. The Consent Holder shall arrange a site meeting between the principal contractor and the assigned Council monitoring officer at least five days prior to commencement of construction.
- No discharge of wastes (e.g. sewage, oil, contaminated bilge water) shall occur from any vessel or activity associated with the construction or use of the altered and extended Paihia Wharf Facilities.

The Consent Holder shall exercise these consents during construction in a manner which ensures that during construction activities, the quality of the receiving waters, at any point 20 metres from the Paihia Wharf structures meets the following standards:

- All vehicles or equipment entering the coastal marine area associated with the exercise of these consents shall be in a good state of repair and free of any leaks e.g. oil, diesel etc.
- 11 Construction works within the coastal marine area shall only be carried out during the hours between sunrise and sunset or 6.00 a.m. and 8.00 p.m., whichever occurs earlier and on days other than Sundays and Public Holidays.
- 12 Construction noise levels associated with the exercise of these consents shall not exceed those set out in **attached** Schedule 1.
- The Consent Holder shall notify the Council's Monitoring Manager in writing as soon as the construction of the building and wharf alterations and extensions have been completed.
- The Consent Holder shall, immediately upon completion of the installation of the altered and extended wharf facility notify in writing:

The Consent Holder shall include a scale plan of the completed works with the notification.

CONDITIONS SPECIFIC TO AUT.005454.46.01 – EXCLUSIVE OCCUPATION

- The Consent Holder may exclude members of the public at any time from the area shown as Occupation Area on the attached marked up Far North Holdings Limited Plan: "Paihia Wharf and Ferry Building Deck Extension", Drawing Title: "Proposed Roof Plan", Project No. 1501, Rev. 3, Sheet No. 104, Dated 31/08/2015. (Also referenced as Northland Regional Council Plan No. 4640/3A)
- In the event that the building and/or deck areas cease to be used for café/restaurant purposes the Consent Holder shall make the café deck area available for public pedestrian access and use, free of charge, at all times, other than times when it is necessary to limit public pedestrian access for reasons of operational necessity or public safety. Any limitation of public access for reasons of safety or operational necessity shall be over the minimum area and for the minimum time necessary.

Construction Sound levels will be measured in accordance with New Zealand Standard NZS 6803:1999 "Acoustics – Construction Noise". Measurement will be at any point on the line of Mean High Water Springs (MHWS) on the adjacent foreshore.

Notes: 1 "Short-term" means construction work any one location for up to 14 calendar days.

"Typical duration" means construction work at any one location for more than 14 calendar days, but less than 20 weeks.

"Long-term" means construction work at any one location with a duration exceeding 20 weeks.

- Noise levels L_{10} , L_{95} and L_{max} are measured in dBA. Definitions are as follows:
 - (a) dBA means the sound level obtained when using a sound level meter having its frequency response A-weighted. (See IEC 651);
 - (b) L_{max} means the maximum noise level (dBA) measured;
 - (c) L₉₅ means the noise level (dBA) equalled or exceeded for 95% of the measurement time;
 - (d) L_{10} as for L_{95} except that the percentage figure is 10%.
