

Shalom and Kia ora,

Thank you for indicating your expression of interest in the upcoming 'Mission to the Startup Nation' via the UAE. As the Executive Director of an NGO that works to bring NZ and Israel closer together through trade and innovation, I'm heartened by your curiosity and your enthusiasm to learn more about what Israel has to offer.

This initiative is a partnership between the New Zealand Israel Innovation Hub (NZIIH), the Auckland Business Chamber, the New Zealand Middle East Business Council (NZMEBC) and the Israel Australia, NZ, and Oceania Chamber of Commerce (IACC). Everything is ready to go, and I am proud to share with you the details of the delegation.

Before you review them, I want you to know that this trip presents an unparalleled opportunity for participants to immerse themselves in one of the world's most innovative environments. The objective of the mission is to uncover opportunities for trade and partnerships between Israel and New Zealand and to explore the 'Startup Nation." We expect that the Mission will result in deals and learnings that can be bought back and adapted to support New Zealand's own tech transformation. The delegation will explore advancements in AI, cybersecurity, agri-tech, food-tech, construction, climate-tech and other tech relevant to New Zealand's economy.

The itinerary contained in the following pages was put together by the IACC. I am extremely grateful for their involvement as they are both experienced and sought-after as delegation organisers. Just this year alone, the IACC is hosting 18 delegations coming from across the globe (though mostly Australia). Indeed, having been on several delegations to Israel myself, I can confirm the itinerary looks absolutely fantastic and I expect the trip to be equally memorable and professionally beneficial. Keep in mind that the itinerary for the UAE is still being developed and the final document will depend on numbers joining us to the end.

This will be the first NZ-centric delegation to Israel post-Covid. Previous delegations, such as the one led by Simon Moutter in 2016, focussed on the emergence of Israel as a tech power and how NZ could learn from Israel's transition towards the digital economy. However, much has changed since 2016, including the signing of the Abraham Accords, and so Israel's tech ecosystem today is vastly different to the one that existed then. Thus, the focus of this delegation is different; delegates will be presented with a big-picture view over Israel's tech ecosystem, but this time, we also expect an outcome of the delegation to be an uptick in bilateral trade and the signing of R&D and business partnerships.

It was part of the World War) Sinai and Palestine campaign, where Kiwi soldiers defeated a large Ottoman counter-offensive, liberating Jewish settlements. s9(2)(a)

found the name "Sarona" during his research, inspiring the naming of a subdivision in New Zealand. An encounter with Israelis strengthened the connection, leading to an unveiling at Gan Sorek. The Silver Fern sculpture replicates one from Sarona Park, New Zealand honoring the 18,000 New Zealanders who served, and the 53 who died in the Palestine campaign. The memorial symbolizes the enduring friendship between New Zealand and Israel and pays tribute to the bravery of these soldiers.


