Official Information Act request relating to evidence supporting the decision to repeal smokefree legislation

Thank you for your request made under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), received on 4 December 2023. You requested:

"Speaking to RNZ you have said that the law would have had unintended consequences including a largely untaxed black market, increased crime and issues around enforcement.

I'm asking for the evidence you have that the Smoke-free legislation you are repealing would have resulted in an increase in crime and black market. Specifically who provided this evidence and on what basis.."

I believe that the information you have requested is more closely connected to the functions of the Associate Minister of Health, Hon Casey Costello.
