Emergency Procedures

If you have a problem during a bailiff visit

The following table shows procedures to follow if you have a problem during a bailiff visit.

Procedure	Description
Leave the property	If you think you are at risk, leave the property. Your training and good judgement will guide you on the right time to leave. Activate your MDA if you feel threatened.
	Never put yourself in harm's way. For example, do not enter a home unless absolutely necessary, do not prevent someone getting away in a car, and do not block doors.
	Do not deal with high-risk situations if your health and safety is at risk. If you feel you are in danger leave immediately
	Do not allow a situation to escalate, leave immediately and reassess once you are safe.
	If you are unable to leave the property for whatever reason and an incident occurs and you require assistance, always activate your MDA. As soon as you are in a safe position, call the monitoring company (if you miss their call) and update them as to the situation. You may also call 111.
Post visit	Once you are safe follow the post visit requirements including a post-visit risk assessment and any other post visit actions.
Make a complaint to Police	If you make a complaint to police after an incident or witnessing an incident you may need to:
	provide the Police with a copy of a doctor's certificate
	file a claim for reparation
	testify in court
	give an official statement.
	Notify your Team Manager as soon as possible.
	Record that you have made a complaint in your incident reporting.
	Enter any alerts or notes into HASARD. See \underline{HASARD} user \underline{guide} for more information.
	If you can, record QID or officer in charge and job number on your Incident Report.
