Final Decision	
Decision – Revoke entry permission	<i>Having considered all of information before me, I have decided to revoke your entry permission. You are now liable for turnaround and you will be placed on the first available craft departing New Zealand.</i>
Do you have anything else to say?	<hr/>
Decision Maintained	<i>My decision is maintained. Your entry permission has been revoked. You are now liable for turnaround and you will be placed on the first available craft departing New Zealand.</i>
Future implications	<i>If you wish to return to New Zealand in the future you will need a visa issued by Immigration New Zealand.  If you do not have a visa you will not be permitted to travel to New Zealand.</i>
Do you understand this?	
Explanation – Carrier obligations	<i>We will now make arrangements for your departure on the first available craft departing New Zealand. You will be returned to your last port of entry or to a country where you have right of entry.</i>
<b>Explanation – Police Custody</b>	<i>You will be placed in custody with the NZ Police pending your departure on the first available flight from NZ.  This detention is for Immigration purposes only as you have not been allowed entry to NZ. You have not been charged with any offences and have no criminal record.  While in Police Custody you will have to follow their standard procedures, and these will be further explained by the Police Officers.</i>
Explanation – other i.e. Day Room arrangements, etc.

Considerations	Is pax part of Family Group?

	Insufficient INZ monitoring staff?	
	Pax likely desperate or invested heavily to gain access to NZ? (likely to abscond)	
	Is departure flight unlikely to remove pax within 24 hours of the decision?	

If there are considerations noted (Y in green areas) then please consider their possible eligibility to remain in the transit area for no more than 24 hours pending their departure on the first available craft departing New Zealand. However, any risks (Y in red area) will necessarily result in passenger being placed in Police Custody.
