# Section 3 - Civilian Clothing

### 3.83 General

- a. Liberty personnel can wear plain clothes as promulgated. Particular attention is to be given to the cleanliness and repair of all plain clothes including footwear and headdress. No tears, fraying or excessive fading is permitted. Clothing is to be clean, dry, neat, tidy and ironed.
- b. Personnel who return to the confines of the NSC whilst on any type of leave are reminded that they are to comply with the dress standards.
- c. When wearing civilian clothing personnel are to be aware that:
  - (1) they remain in all respects subject to the Armed Forces Discipline Act (AFDA),
  - (2) the service accepts no liability for loss of or damage to civilian clothing except in certain circumstances,
  - (3) identity cards are to be carried at all times, and
  - (4) service uniform clothing items are not to be worn with civilian clothing.

# 3.84 Dress Standards

- a. In today's modern climate the Navy is more often in the public eye and with this in mind, a higher than average standard of presentability while in civilian dress needs to be maintained. Naval dress standards are not designed to set the trend or fashion but rather to move behind it. The following are the minimum acceptable equivalents to the uniform dress of the day:
  - (1) dress walk shorts/dress/skirt/trousers/jeans,
  - (2) open neck collared shirt/polo shirts/t-shirt; and
  - (3) shoes and sandals.
- b. The following guidelines are promulgated for the wearing of civilian clothes:
  - (1) Personnel are not to wear slippers, jandals/thongs, abbreviated shorts (cut offs) or singlets outside the confines of their living quarters. Personnel are not to walk or run around in bare feet within the confines of any defence establishment or ship.
  - (2) Dress shirts, 'polo' shirts and high quality dress t-shirts can be worn provided that they do not include slogans or artwork of a derogatory, obscene or offensive nature. Small company logos or insignia are acceptable. T-shirts worn for PT are not to be worn ashore as civilian attire. T-shirts produced by a ship or establishment are to have the express approval of the CO before production begins and are to meet all the criteria described in the preceding paragraphs if they are to be worn.
  - (3) Shorts can be worn at any time but must be of a 'dress' style that normally infers pockets. Designer shorts are acceptable. Shorts worn for participation in sports events/PT are not acceptable as plain clothes.
  - (4) Dress sandals can be worn with shorts (no plastic Roman sandals).
  - (5) Sports shoes when worn with plain clothes are to be in a good state of repair and clean.
  - (6) Boat shoes and other types of shoe that are specifically designed to be worn without socks or stockings can be worn with long trousers, shorts, and skirts. Other types of shoes when worn as plain clothes, are to be worn with socks.
  - (7) Civilian baseball caps can be worn ashore with plain clothes and sports rig. Caps are not to be worn back to front at any time.
  - (8) Trousers do not include track suit/taslon etc type pants. Three quarter trousers are acceptable. Walk shorts do not include nylon or taslon PT shorts, or any shorts worn for PT purposes.

c. The CO is to consider the withdrawal of plain clothes privileges for those personnel who fail to comply with the standards.

### 3.85 Restrictions

- a. From time to time there can be a requirement to tighten the dress standards of a ship's company. This could result from cultural or religious sensitivities, or ceremonial requirements.
- b. This will mean enforcing the wearing of a 'fold down' collar and possibly restricting the wearing of shorts/skirts. This will be promulgated either internally by daily orders or externally by administration instruction if necessary.

### 3.86 Recreational Sports Dress

- a. Athletic singlets, t-shirts and running shorts can be worn by personnel running, power walking or cycling between home and duty, and can be worn when proceeding directly to games in the naval base or by personnel proceeding on bona fide training runs:
- b. When proceeding to or from the ship, sports rig is not to be worn when:
  - (1) shopping or visiting public places for business;
  - (2) proceeding to or from home in a vehicle; or
  - (3) posting in or out of a ship or shore establishment.

### 3.87 Motorcycles/Cycling

For safety reasons personnel travelling by motorcycle are permitted to wear the appropriate protective clothing e.g. leather or PVC outfits. Helmets are to be worn at all times when cycling within the confines of the NSC. Personnel are to wear the appropriate headdress when walking around in public areas after alighting from their motorcycles.

# 3.88 Personnel Attending Tertiary Institutions

- a. Personnel attending tertiary institutions are to wear uniform at all times. The exceptions when plain clothes can be worn are:
  - (1) during enrolment;
  - (2) capping week;
  - (3) sitting final exams; or
  - (4) when directed by the Commander Leadership Development (CLD).
- b. Tertiary institutions are an 'off caps' area.

### 3.89 Naval Police Personnel

Naval police personnel can wear plain clothes whilst employed on duties involving:

- (1) operations, training or liaison with civilian law enforcement authorities;
- (2) investigations of a delicate or sensitive nature where uniform is inappropriate; or
- (3) investigations outside naval/defence units.

### 3.90 Marks of Respect

When in plain clothes personnel are to stand to attention for:

- (1) The National Anthem.
- (2) Colours.
- (3) Sunset.
- (4) A gun salute.

(5) A passing staff car with flags/disc displayed.

# 3.91 Drug Advocation

Wearing or displaying clothing, jewellery, tattoos etc depicting marijuana, any other controlled substance or advocating drug abuse is prohibited at all times on any military establishment/unit or under any circumstance that is likely to discredit the Navy.




Fig. 3-3B WO/SR

Fig 3. Flyers Dress - RNZN Aircrew




Annex 3-A. Shaping Your RNZN Beret

# **RESHAPING A BERET**



Fit the beret to your head and adjust the cord as necessary. Wait until the beret is dry before cutting the excess cord in case you have to re adjust the fit after the beret is dry.

Wet the beret. Fill up the hand basin with warm water and drop the beret into soak. Using hot water on the black rim will shrink the beret. If your beret is slightly too large, using hot water is a good idea. If your beret already fits your head snugly, be sure to avoid hot water.

Get rid of all the extra water you can by gently wringing out the beret. It will still be damp, but make sure there is no more dripping water.

Shape the beret. Place the damp beret on your head and align the cap badge above your left eye. Pull all excess fabric down on the right side of your head by folding it with your hands. Repeat this action several times making sure the fabric on top is completely smooth.

Allow the beret to dry on your head. Doing this will keep the beret from shrinking too much and will form the beret more closely to the exact shape of your head. If necessary, you may need to hold the fold down with one hand until it becomes secure. You may take the beret off if it is still slightly damp after an hour and place it down to dry naturally.

# Annex 3-B. Replacing the Male Officer/Senior Ratings Peaked Cap Cover



The overall structure of this hat allows the user to squeeze the hat without damaging the overall shape and appearance. When squeezing the hat ensure you squeeze from sidewall to sidewall as indicated in the picture. This will give you best results when fitting the hat cover.



Squeeze the hat from sidewall to sidewall so that you can hold the hat almost together in one hand.



Squeeze the hat tight enough so you can manipulate it into the hat cover. Make sure the complete crown is inside the cover before releasing the hat inside.



If parts of the crown are not inside the cover, squeeze the sidewalls and shape the cover until it is level with the black cap band.

Some shaping maybe required. Gently pull the inner works of the hat structure to fill out the cover. Tuck the hat cover walls under the black band.



Reverse the instructions to take hat cover off.

# Annex 3-C. Tying A Cap Ribbon



Centre the tally with the centre letter including gaps, under the front seam of the cap. Tie an overhand knot directly under the left hand seam of the cap holding the tally firmly in position with the thumb until the bow is formed.



The upper tail is brought down and up again to form the first bight of the bow.



The lower tail is passed over the first bight and then up on the outside.



A bight is formed in the right hand sail and tucked behind the top end of the first bight.



The tally can be steamed over a boiling kettle and tails trimmed to shape.



The bow and knot are now carefully formed and tightened.
