




Ordinary Votes - Daily & Cumulative







A strong wind watch is in force for Canterbury High Country, and Otago excluding Clutha from 1700hrs tomorrow to 0800hrs Thursday morning.




Severe Weather Outlook

A westerly flow will be active over New Zealand from tomorrow until Saturday with embedded fronts moving over the country at times. This will result in strong westerly winds about central and southern New Zealand as well as periods of heavy rain about the western South Island.

As a front heads north over the South Island late Wednesday and Thursday morning, there is moderate confidence that westerly winds will reach severe gale about southern Otago (especially near the coast), Southland and Fiordland.


Another cold front moves north over the country on Friday and Saturday, followed by a strong northwest flow. This front brings a period of heavy rain to the western South Island, with moderate confidence of warning rainfall amounts about Canterbury High Country near the man divide and southern Westland on Friday and early Saturday.

There is moderate confidence northwest winds could reach severe gale for exposed parts of Clutha, Southland and Southern Fiordland on Friday.

NZ DART Network Degradation

There has been no changes to the DART Network status first reported in the Daily Intelligence Briefing on Friday 6 October. This is considered business as usual by GNS Science. Coverage in the region remains at a good level with the system including built in redundancy. Only significant updates of relevance will be reported on in the future.

Marianas bunkering down as tropical storm Bolaven approaches

Tropical storm Bolaven is predicted to turn into a typhoon and hit the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) tomorrow. A tropical storm warning is in effect for Guam, meaning winds between 63 and 117kmh are expected within the next 24 hours. A typhoon watch remains in place for Guam, Rota, Tinian and Saipan.
