




The Ministry is providing funding for the Project to the Recipient on the terms and conditions set in this Agreement.


Agreement

SCHEDULE 1 – AGREEMENT DETAILS

1. BACKGROUND

Careers NZ estimates that by 2030 approximately 30% of students and therefore future workforce will be Māori. The need to progress these outcomes has occurred due to the limited options Māori students have to assist them to progress through to achieving and sustaining high value careers in STEM related industries.

This Partnership and funding will positively contribute to rangatahi becoming self-determined empowered leaders bridging Te Ao Māori and innovation into the STEM economy.

This funding is essential to aide Pūhoro Charitable Trust Board to its full establishment as part of an independent by Māori for Māori organisation with the capacity and capability to deliver a Science Technology Engineering Mathematics and Mātauranga (STEMM) programme for rangatahi.

2. PURPOSE

2.1 The purpose of the Funding is to:

- (a) Organisational Baseline
This aspect enables organisational central operations to be expanded through contributing to costs not associated to direct delivery in schools. It also aides in furthering existing iwi relationships in all delivery regions.
- (b) Regional Delivery
This aspect enables delivery across the 7 regions of South Auckland, Waikato/Tainui, Ruapehu, Whanganui, Hawkes Bay, Manawatū and Christchurch with proposed growth to two new regions per year totalling 11 regions at the end of 2023. Each region will have a tripartite agreement with the Ministry a partner in all regions.

3. CONDITIONS

3.1 The Recipient must:

- (a) Meet all achievements and reporting as jointly determined in section 4;
- (b) Attend all meetings as specified in section 4;
- (c) Ensure that it uses this funding for the purposes set out in this Agreement.

BACKGROUND

- A The Ministry (Purchasing Agency) and Provider are parties to an agreement for Pūhoro Charitable Trust dated 29 June 2021 (the *Agreement*). This partnership aims to provide better educational opportunities for ākonga, together, they will develop programs and initiatives that aim to increase engagement, develop ākonga abilities, and provide them with the skills they need to succeed.
- B The Agreement seeks to work in collaboration to achieve jointly agreed high priority outcomes. This collaboration represents a significant step forward in improving education in Aotearoa and it is expected to result in better outcomes for Ākonga Māori across the country.
- C The parties wish to vary the Agreement upon the terms and conditions as detailed in this variation below.

THE PARTIES AGREE as follows:

1 INTERPRETATION

1.1 Defined terms

In this variation, unless the context requires otherwise, words and expressions defined, and references construed, in the Agreement and not otherwise defined or construed in this variation will, where used in this variation, have the same meanings and constructions as those given to them in the Agreement.

1.2 Construction

Clauses: a reference to a clause is to a clause of this variation;

Documents: a reference to any document, including this variation, includes a reference to that document as amended or replaced from time to time;

Headings: headings appear as a matter of convenience and do not affect the construction of this variation.

Parties: a reference to a party to this variation or any other document includes that party's personal representatives/successors and permitted assigns.

Singular, Plural and Gender: the singular includes the plural and vice versa, and words importing one gender *include* the other genders.

2 CONFIRMATION

Except as expressly varied by this variation, all terms of the Agreement continue in full force and effect and are acknowledged and confirmed by each of the parties.

3 VARIATION

With effect from **upon signing**, the Agreement is varied as follows:

- 3.1 Increasing agreement amount from 9(2)(b)(ii) (current) to 9(2)(b)(ii) (total whole life of contract) – an additional Note, figures are exclusive of GST.
- 3.2 Extending term of agreement from 1 July 2023 to 31 January 2027 – an additional three years, seven months. Current expiry, 30 June 2023.


